Area Runners

Chula Vista: Ambition Fits To a 'Tee'

he T-shirts say it all. On the front is a simple statement: "We're baack."

It's must-wear for Chula Vista runners these days, as they relish their hard-won prominence in boys cross country.

Chula Vista High has had a long, rich heritage in running, and has now returned to glory.

The boys team won the large schools boys race at the CIF meet last year, and returns the entire team. They are ba-ack.

In some quarters, the Spartans were lightly regarded last season, before the championship meets. Nobody questioned their credentials at the end, and they are similarly esteemed now, earning the top ranking in a coaches' poll, ahead of a top-quality Vista team they will meet later.

It seems to be a vintage year for good boys teams in Division I in the San Diego Section, and the team that takes the local CIF meet will be a threat at the state level.

"Our goal is to be ranked in the top three in the state," one of the Chula Vista coaches, Art Johnson told TM.

Jeanne Johnson is Art's wife and co-coach. She trains the boys team while he coaches the Chula girls.

"When we first started here," Art said, "she had a little trouble from the boys. The team went on a run with her, and some of the boys picked up the pace. When she stayed right with them, she got their respect."



about ten boys and even less girls," Art Johnson remembered. The total squad now numbers 60-plus.

"I was teaching at Chula Vista Junior High (where he still works) and we kept sending them these good runners and wondering what was happening to them."

"When the high school job opened up a few years ago, some kids asked me to take it," he recalled. For Chula Vista alum

Johnson, it was a return to his roots.

It's been a steady upward procession from there, fueled by hard work and dedication.

The Spartans have good quality at the top in Ruben Carrillo, but it's the excellence all through the top five that puts them on a higher level than most.

Carrillo was 4th in the CIF meet last year, and ran 15:59 at Fresno. He is the undisputed team leader. In a recent race, the pack looked to Carrillo for leadership.

"Get behind Ruben," they told each other in the early stages of the meet.

"I just wanted the pack to run with me," he said later.

Begin to Turn Up the Heat he season is starting to heat up. Teams are starting the cyle of

league meets, and invitationals are beginning to taper off.

It's the time of the season which one coach calls the "doldrums." The initial excitement of the opening meets has passed, and the taper for the end of the year has not yet begun.

Among the recent developments:

DANA HILLS:

At the Dana Hills Invitational, on Sept. 24, a number of this area's best teams took on many of the best Orange County teams, with good success.

Poway, Torrey Pines and San Diego each won two teams races, while Vista, Chula Vista, Scripps Ranch and Ramona each won a single team championship.

Chula Vista took home the large schools senior boys championship. The Spartans placed four in the top 15, led by Ruben Carrillo and Jorge Martinez in third and fourth.

Mt. Carmel was the team runner-up in that race, with two finishers in the top ten, led by Greg Nett.

Vista didn't field a full team in that race, but had the individual winner in Trevor Sybert (14:37 for the fast 3.0-mile course).

Vista had the individual winner in the large school boys junior and sophomore races as well. Jason Land was the top junior (15:05), while Steve Ketcham paced the sophs (15:45).

Also in the large schools junior boys, area runners took four of the first six places. Mt. Carmel was the top area team, placing fourth.

Vista was second in team scoring in the Div. I soph race, and area runners took three of the

Making it up as we go along...

he first issue is always the toughest.
Anyway, that's been my experience as a publisher. Getting the first issue of TRACK MAGAZINE into your hands was an interesting experience.

As a publisher, this is my second venture. I thought my experience as the owner-publisher of a small-town newspaper here in Julian had prepared me for this undertaking. It helped, but there were enough major differences to keep me offstride.

Gathering the news is slightly more difficult than I had imagined. So many teams, so many coaches, and now the competition is becoming widely scattered. Over the long term, most coaches and teams will want to be included, and our coverage will be very representative. For the short term, however, it's going to be a scramble. We'll do the best we can to include as much results as we can obtain. Coaches, parents or athletes are welcome to submit information at any time.

Our method of distribution is still being invented. The original concept of direct mail is still the final goal. I am working on alternate delivery systems as well, including handing out the paper at meets or dropping it off at many schools.

Advertising is seemingly off to a slow start, but that's partly by design. I knew that I would have to produce at least one issue before there would be any interest from targeted businesses. My advertising rates are constructed to achieve a final ratio of about five pages of editorial content to one page of advertising. That means most ads will be relatively small, which is beneficial in two

ways. First, the small advertiser will not see their ad get "lost" in vast pages of advertising. And it won't take too many ads for TRACK MAGAZINE to be viable.

I am concentrating on larger businesses as a starting point. If any readers know of a small business that can profit from exposure in these pages, let us know.

The circulation for the first issue was just over 2,200 copies distributed, almost exclusively to the area's young athletes and their coaches. It's an attractive demographic: 2,200-plus young, active and involved student-athletes.

Those and other minor problems aside, I'm starting to settle in to this job. There is a lot of room for improvement, and the finetuning will be constant.

The goal is to produce a regional track and cross country publication that measures up to the quality of this area's athletes and coaches. They deserve it.

In defense of the rankings...

are not comfortable with the weekly coaches' poll, or cross country rankings that are published in TRACK MAGAZINE and the San Diego Union.

I personally have no problem with the idea of ranking the local cross-country teams, even though sometimes I may have some

For the record, the rankings, or coaches' poll, are the product of a few area high school coaches who follow the sport avidly.

The rankings are updated weekly in the *Union-Tribune* (published each Tuesday morning), and are updated every two weeks by *TM*.

If you're not a careful observer, you might get the impression that there are two sets of rankings. Since we only publish biweekly, you might see a ranking in the *UT* that differs from the one we carry. There is only one poll.

The coaches who make up the ratings are the product of local high school programs and are long-time observers of high school cross country and track and field.

I know that they attempt to be as fair and as objective as possible as they analyze and rate the teams. If there are omissions and discrepancies, it is only because they may not have all the available facts.

You'll notice, for example, that there are some dramatic changes over the course of the season. That occurs as more results bring the local picture into sharper focus, not because some teams fall apart or dramatically improve.

It's a bit of an art comparing cross country teams anyway. Many teams never compete head-to-head. Times run in widely scattered meets are of only secondary importance as course, climate and competition must be taken into account.

Invitationals are a big help in comparing teams, but also are not completely definitive. They give an idea as to relative strength, but shouldn't be taken as a literal prediction of future results.

As inexact as they must be, I still like the rankings. They are an attempt to recognize the area's quality teams. At the very least they get people thinking and talking about

cross country, which is a definite plus.

If you think your team is being shortchanged, feel free to tell me. If you have some information to support your claim, I know the pollsters will listen. And it doesn't hurt for your team's results to be published as often as possible, in these pages, the *Union-Tribune*, and your local paper.

The bottom line in cross country is the competition at the end of the year. Rankings are fun, but what really counts are the championship meets. Fortunately for athletes, coaches, writers, parents and fans alike, the important issues will be decided in fair and direct competition, all the way through to the State Meet in Fresno (and, for individuals, to the national championships held right here at Morley Field).

Devon Straitiff paced the older girls win, taking second. In the frosh race, the Falcons placed four in the top seven, led by Danielle Valentino.

Scripps Ranch won the senior race, with Kevin Bowes also winning the individual title. The team placed all five in the top 12 to win handily.

STANFORD:

The Scripps Ranch boys were first in Div. II at Palo Alto, on Oct. 1. Bowes (3rd) again led the pack, which placed six runners in the top 24.

The West Hills girls team was third in Div. III. Freshman Alexis Rendina was their top runner, taking eighth. The Wolfpack's top five all finished in the first 28. Top area runner in the race was USD's Vanessa Hanley, in sixth.

SOUTH BAY:

This meet was the first local

meet this year to tabulate scores in a varsity team format.

Bonita Vista, El Capitan and USD won the girls team races, while Fallbrook, Hoover and St. Augustine took the boys trophies.

Bonita Vista also had the fastest girl on the day, with Claire Becker leading her teammates to a close win over Fallbrook (50-52) in Div. I. The Barons used depth to win, with Rosie Costello and Meghann Phillips keying the win by racing 5th and 6th.

El Cap's girls had an easier time in Div. II, with Larissa Gregerson winning the race. Jenny Card and Sarah Jagers were 3rd and 7th.

Div. III girls was close, with USD beating Santana, 42-49. Santana's Jaymie Harper won the race, recording the third fastest overall time of the day.

Fallbrook's boys won the Div. I title, although secondplace Point Loma's Chris Werdenberg won the race.

Hoover and their ace, Ayub Abdusalam were both impressive in the Div. II race. The Cardinals scored 39 points to beat Grossmont. Abdusalam ran the fastest boys time of the day to win, and teammates Francis Bachu and Julius Amicho were 3rd and 4th.

St. Augustine used balance to win the Div. III race, with their five all making the top 12. Mission Bay went 2-4-6 and took second as a team, ahead of West Hills. USD's Ross Damman won the race.

SMALL SCHOOLS:

Div. IV team Coronado provided both individual winners. Trevor Clarke ran 16:33 for the 3.1-mile Morley Field layout, while Jessica Lunt was clocked in 16:32 in the 2.5-mile girls race.

DUALS, TRI-MEETS:

A number of traditional rivals have met in early meets (Helix and Grossmont, Chula Vista and Sweetwater, Vista and Poway), but the highlight has been a non-league meet that pitted three of the area's strongest boy teams.

Chula Vista, Scripps Ranch and Rancho Bernardo mixed it up at Morley Field on Sept. 21, and the Spartans won this round with their quality depth.

Scripps' Kevin Bowes won the race as each of the teams ran evenly through the first nine places.

The difference came when Chula Vista's fourth and fifth boys took 10th and 11th, sealing the win.

The Grossmont/Helix dual was dramatic, as at first Grossmont seemed to win a one-point victory. A disqualification resulted in a 28-28 score with the win going to Helix by the sixthman tiebreaker.

next three or four runners can run with Carrillo.

Last year, Jose Ramirez, now a junior, was 9th at CIF. Jorge Martinez was a second behind Carrillo in the recent Dana Hills Invitational. And Jason White has been near the front in a number of big races.

Matt Dunn, last year's fifth man, is also a potential scholarship athlete, Art Johnson feels.

There's more talent in the six slot, too. Larry Romero has transferred from Arizona and has already run 16:20 at Dana Hills (3.0 miles).

"We already have six runners that have qualified for the Footlocker Regional seeded race," Jeanne Johnson pointed out.

It's a tough year to be good in the San Diego Section. Vista is another outstanding team that nobody is discounting. Mt. Carmel is also a real threat.

"We were a little ahead of Vista at the Mt. Carmel Invitational," Art Johnson said. "But they were a little faster than us at Dana Hills."

Vista had their top runners scattered among several class races, while Chula Vista was able to race five quality runners in the senior race, which they won.

Chula Vista has already run head-on into some great competition. They raced against most of San Diego and Orange County's best at those invites and they also were a principal team in a rare, three-way, non-league meet with Scripps Ranch and Rancho Bernardo.


The Spartans won that meet, besting teams that are currently ranked second and fourth.

The girls squad, last year's Metro League runner-up, is "re-building," according to Jeanne Johnson.

Three girls trade off leading the team, including senior Aura DeTrinidad, and juniors Yolanda Montalvo and Liz Gonzalez. Nika Dunn is another quality athlete. The team might mature into the Metro front-runners in another season.

All this success comes from a combination of factors: the inspiration of coaches who work as hard as their runners, the above-average school pride at Chula Vista, and the family atmosphere projected by the team members.





LOOKING AHEAD: Division Moves Create New Match-Ups

Section announced its annual revisions to the cross country state divisions, some interesting new match-ups were created.

Division II, already crowded and extremely competitive, gained added strength as Division III powerhouse teams Scripps Ranch and West Hills moved up in class.

Since last year, four other teams have also changed divisions.

Granite Hills and Montgomery have switched divisions. Granite Hills moved up from Division II to I, while Montgomery has dropped from I to II.

Division III has shrunk.
West Hills and Scripps Ranch
have left, and Lincoln Prep has
dropped to Division IV. The
division has added Mission Bay,
moving down from II.

In terms of competition, the changes make things shape up like this:

DIV. I: Add Granite Hills' Wendy Murphy to an already crowded group of outstanding girl runners.

After powerful girls teams like Vista, Mt. Carmel, Poway, Bonita Vista and Fallbrook finish dividing up the spoils, it's going to be a fierce fight for the five individual berths.

Chula Vista and Vista are the current co-favorite boys teams, but Mt. Carmel, Rancho Bernardo, Poway and other quality teams make the competition very strong.

DIV II: Newcomer
Scripps Ranch will clash with
teams such as Hoover and Torrey Pines for the boys title.
Other quality teams include
Grossmont, Point Loma, San
Pasqual and Helix. In fact, there
is talent on almost every team in
this division.

In the girls competition, new addition West Hills will contend with Torrey Pines, El Capitan, Valhalla and San Pasqual. Here, too, any number of teams will be a threat for at least individual honors.

DIV III: The loss of Scripps Ranch and West Hills has created opportunity.

In the boys race, Ramona might seem the new favorite, but will get a fight from St. Augustine, newcomer Mission Bay, and possibly La Jolla and USD.

DIVISION IV: Tradition Built Step at a Time at Bishop's

Few will argue that Bishop's is the current ranking power in the Coastal League and a force in Division IV CIF races.

It's a recent development that exactly coincided with the arrival of coach Vincent Stumpo just over two years ago.

Stumpo found both the girls and boys programs in disarray. Although the La Jolla school had produced talented runners most years, there wasn't much of a team tradition.

That's all changed, and tradition is being built, race by race.

Stumpo didn't have a single returning girl runner on his team when he first arrived. He put together a young, hard-working team that won the league finals easily and gave Coronado a scare in the CIF race. The star of that team was freshman Marissa Hurwitz, who ended her season by placing in the top ten in Division IV at the state level.

She's been hampered by injuries the last two seasons, and

hasn't been able to contribute, but that hasn't stopped Bishop's.

The girls were even better last year, dominating the Coastal League and winning the CIF title as well.

This year, the girls team is favored to win the league again, and Coronado is the only division rival that might challenge them.

The Bishop's boys are also sharply improved. They lost to Calvin Christian in the league finals last year, by a tie-breaker, and are a threat to win this year.

Stumpo was discouraged about both teams' fitness in August but is now "cautiously optimistic."

"Summer training did not go well for us this year," he said. "Some of our kids didn't run a step."

But now, after a base has been laid, the team is showing signs of life.

"The girls have had a really good attitude," Stumpo said. "It is a real good bunch to work with. The boys are struggling for an identity. We lost some of our leadership from last year."

At the South Bay Invitational, on Sept. 24, the girls team was fourth, behind Div. III powers USD, Santana and OLP.

Their team time was faster than schools such as Grossmont, Hill-top or Carlsbad.

At the Small Schools Invitational last week, Bishop's was second to OLP in the private schools competition, despite an injury that hampered key runner Gabe Popoff.

Popoff had been the team's fastest in each race this season to date, but suffered a cramped or pulled muscle, and she ran back in the pack.

Other Bishop's runners picked up the slack. Katherine Zabloudil and Stephanie Pettigrew, both All-CIF last year, had their best races of the season.

Mary-Beth Muchmore made a breakthrough that Stumpo had been privately predicting, taking fifth in that race. Zabloudil was 7th, followed by Nichola Lowry, 9th, and Pettigrew, 15th.


The Small Schools meet is often used as a barometer of the ensuing Coastal League and CIF meets (both on the same course). Counting just Coastal League runners, Bishop's took four of the first five spots.

Counting just Division IV schools, they placed four in the top eight, and that's without a good race from Popoff or any contribution from Hurwitz, who still might contribute later.

"We were hoping that (Saturday) was going to be her first race," Stumpo said. "But she's still not ready. We just hope she can run by the end of the year."

Bishop's boys team, on paper, had just about everybody back from a team that just missed the league title.

There have been unanticipated setbacks. Of last year's top

seven, one is playing club soccer, one has quit, another is injured and last year's number one man reported out-of-shape.

Miles Shumilak, a sophomore transfer from La Jolla, is the new number one. P.J. Ople, a multi-talented track man, is a strong number two runner.

With Stumpo's history, you have to figure the rest of the team will fall into place by the end of the year.

There is no clear-cut favorite in the boys race at the Coastal League championship this year.

LATE NEWS: Vista Girls 2nd at Stanford Meet

s any team, counting both boys and girls, running as well right now as Vista? Silly question, right?

This is a team whose boys can hang with Chula Vista and whose girls are right with Torrey Pines.

In fact, the girls are now top-ranked after a week in which they easily defeated highly-regarded Poway and then finished second in the large schools division of the prestigious Stanford Invitational. The Palo Alto meet took place Saturday, Oct. 1.

Lincoln High, from Portland, Oregon, the 10th-ranked team in the country, was the team winner.

Other teams in the race included powerful Irvine and Esperanza, and Bend, Oregon, ranked 8th in the country.

The Vista individual runners were Sonia Rodriguez, 16th in 20:14; Noelle Magana, 23rd in 20:46; Angela Shea, 35th in 20:56; Devon Lasiter-Thurber, 36th in 20:59; Natalie Forsyth, 47th in 21:19; Fatima El Farrah, 50th in 21:22; and Erika Batiz, 113th in 23:05.

In the double-dual with Poway and San Dieguito, at a hilly San Dieguito Park course, Vista was flat-out impressive.

Rodriguez led a team charge that finished 1-3-4-5 and put eight girls in the top twelve.

"They just ran a great team race," coach Paul Kinder said.


Coronado and Bishop's are the girls team favorites. Calvin Christian could be a dark horse.
