On Way UP: Ayub, Hoover

here has been a decided international flavor in San Diego Section cross country in recent years.

Super runners have come from Brazil (Helix' Daniel Das Neves), Eritrea (San Diego's Mebrahtom Keflezighi) and Scotland (Bonita Vista's Claire Becker).

But no team is more international than Hoover.

Coach Rick Telford has on his roster runners from Ethiopia, Uganda, Sudan, Eritrea, Somalia, Mexico and Afghanistan.


American citizen. And, since this nation was settled, founded and constantly revitalized by immigrants, that makes the Hoover team the most American team of all.

Telford and his small but high-powered team has been closely watched by the area's coaches all year. The team keeps raising its level of ability by the week, and the even the top teams are beginning to look over their shoulder.

Pacing the team is junior Ayub Abdusalam, the apparent heir to Keflezighi as the new local star.

He's lost to only one runner all year, to Keith O'Doherty of Division I State Champion Thousand Oaks, at Huntington Beach.

Among Abdusalam's victims have been the local who's who of hot shots, including Kevin Bowes, David McQuitty, Shilo Glass, Trevor Sybert, Tom Kloos, Manuel Romero and Ruben Carrillo. Only Sybert was

even close, trailing by two seconds at last week's Southern Cal Invitational.

"He has the ideal body type for running," Telford said. "He is the complete package."

Telford also likes his mental makeup. "He is very devoted, and he has very little outside distractions."

Abdusalam, from a province of Ethiopia called Oromo, came to America as a political refugee, as did most of the rest of San Diego's African community.

"They allowed visas to anybody who could get out," Telford said, in describing a region torn by civil strife. "They later cut that exit off, and that has served to divide families."

Abdusalam lived for a time with a brother, but now lives alone in an apartment near Hoover.

"He's very independent,"
Telford said. "His brother
moved to La Mesa, to be nearer
his job, and I was trying to think
where Abdusalam could go to
run. But he's very loyal, to me
and to the school."

Abdusalam will be the logical favorite at the Division II CIF race next month, and should be a threat to win at Fresno.

Telford and his star are thinking about bigger game.

"Our goal is to make the nationals," Telford said.

What is really intriguing is how the rest of the team is coming together.

The two and three runners are Francis Bachu, from Uganda,

Vista Lowers Boom at SoCal, TP Rips at SLO

ista made a strong statement in last week's Southern California Invitational at Guajome Park.

The Torrey Pines girls team was also making news, up at San Luis Obispo.

The Vista boys were dominating in the unique format of the Southern Cal meet, wherein number one runners race number one runners, number twos go against number twos and so on.

A Vista boy finished first in four of the seven races, and they were second in the other three races.

"They were just hammering," an impressed Scripps Ranch coach, Bob Oliver, said.

Another impressive team was Hoover's boys. They had the day's top individual, Ayub Abdusalam, and they finished second in team times, ahead of Scripps Ranch.

Vista's girls team showed good balance and depth, finishing second to a strong Yucaipa team.

In team times, the Panthers trailed Temescal by less than 30 seconds, in spite of the fact that Temescal girls placed ahead of Vista in 5 of 7 races.

Temescal, a school from the Lake Elsinore area, was the near equivalent of the Vista boys: they won four of the seven races.

The individual honors went to Hoover's Abdusalam, who is unbeaten against local section runners, and Ramona sophomore Veronica Clark, who handily beat a solid field in the girls Number One race.

A notable absentee was Bonita Vista's Claire Becker, who has been held out of recent competitions after a flare-up of tendinitis.

In boys races, after Vista, Hoover and Scripps, it was a familiar list: Poway, Yucaipa, Rancho Bernardo, Ramona,

It's in the air; Finals are near

he cross country season that once seemed like a long, leisurely stretch is rapidly coming to a critical stage.

The air has turned crisp at times (at least

in Julian), a reminder that the big meets are just around the corner.

In fact the Con T

In fact, the San Diego Section Finals are less than a month after the publication of this issue. League finals are only two or three weeks away as you read this.

"This is an important time of year," Rancho Bernardo coach Don Jones said.

Coaches all over the county are busy mapping out strategies to bring their respective teams to a big finish. There is a bit more urgency to the daily workout. There is a bit more attention paid to detail.

For some, this is a good time to lay low. Months of hard training will take a toll, and teams, or runners, with nagging injuries or illness have one immediate goal: get healthy.

"Right now, it's just a lot of little things," Bishop's coach Vince Stumpo reported. "Just a lot of little injuries that we're trying to shake."

"The flu has gone through our team pretty good," Hilltop coach Chip Holmes said. "It's really affected a lot of the kids."

"I hate sickness," Mt. Carmel coach
Dennis McClanahan commented after the
Poway/Fallbrook meet. "It's going through
our whole team."

At Bonita Vista, standout runner Claire Becker has skipped the last three meets, as a precaution, after a bout of patellar tendinitis.

"She's just doing easy overdistance now," Baron coach Ian Cumming said. "She should be OK by the end of the season."

Some teams are in disarray mentally, trying to regain earlier sharpness, or are trying to deal with unexpected setbacks.

In those cases, although enough time remains to get refocused, it can be tricky for the coach to orchestrate. Some runners need a wake up call, some need a confidence boost, and some need at least a mental vacation.

The teams, or runners, that are currently red-hot are facing a different kind of anxiety: maintaining their edge in the last few weeks. There are a few coaches around that would like to bottle up what they have going now and uncork it in the finals.

Some veteran teams, or at least teams with veteran coaches, are noted for peaking at just the right time, sometimes turning what seems an average season into a good one by raising their level at the right time.

And, there are still teams out there with a few surprises left; teams that have enough room for significant improvement that will allow them to achieve unexpected success. Which teams are in that category, obviously, is unknown.

It's an exciting time of year. Coaches that have carefully plotted workouts for the final few weeks show up each day armed with a long list of contingency plans.

Keeping it together is the name of the game now. There are still cards to be played, and the stakes are about to be raised.

Bolton, a Scripps Ranch junior, ran a quality 16:00 three-mile at Dana Hills, and I overlooked it when computing the results. When figured into the mix, Bolton's time improves Scripps' team time to 78:58, and nudges them ahead of Mt. Carmel among local teams at Dana Hills.

For the record: We misidentified a runner from Our Lady of Peace in our last issue. Victoria Smith, not Jenna Graciano, was the OLP runner leading Madison's Danielle Saylor in the St. Augustine Invitational. We apologize for the error.

Identification of athletes in photos published here can be a bit tricky. Sometimes, it's almost a slapstick process, as I go over the contact sheets with a magnifying glass in one hand and a telephone in the other, trying to describe a runner to a coach.

The Southern California Invitational was a helpful format for photography. Only one runner per team was entered in each race. All I had to do was identify the uniform (not always easy) and the race, and I had the name. For the first time I was able to shoot packs of runners and know that I could name them all later.

Also, it was reported to us that St. Augustine had an incorrect team time listed for the South Bay Invitational. I double-checked the results and the calculations for the Saints and the five schools listed ahead of them but could find no discrepancies. We used the times of the first five runners for each team in each varsity race. Some Frosh/Soph and JV runners had fast races and could affect team times if mixed into the results. Mount Miguel and Point Loma were two schools that would benefit from inclusion of non-varsity runners.

Creative spelling: we still see variations in the spelling of certain athletes' names in various results. Sometimes we get handwritten results that are hard to read. We try to check as much as possible, but can't always get them all. In some cases, we're at the mercy of our sources. A tip for coaches: at invitationals and finals meets, make sure your name tags are legible and correct. When submitting results, use first names as well as last.

Saints to Host First Frosh, Soph Champs

The first annual Freshman and Sophomore Championship cross country meet will debut next month.

The meet's creator and host, St. Augustine coach Jerry Downey, recently announced that the meet will be held on Saturday, Nov. 5. That's two weeks before the section championship meet.

There will be four divisions: Freshman Boys, Freshman Girls, Soph Boys and Soph Girls.

The meet will be open to any San Diego Section school, but entries will be limited to the fastest 75 runners in each race.

The meet's close proximity to the championship schedule may be a dilemma for those coaches with key frosh/soph athletes.

Deadline to enter Monday, Oct. 23. Downey will notify coaches if their entries have made the cutoff on Tues., Nov. 1.

Poway Edges Mt. Carmel, Fallbrook

One of the year's best noninvitational meets was a double dual involving Poway, Mt. Carmel and Fallbrook.

The meet was held at Kit Carson Park on Oct. 7.

The latest coaches' poll has all three girls squads rated in the county's top seven. The Poway and Mt. Carmel boys teams are also ranked in the top seven, while Fallbrook is just outside the top ten.

The competition was as intense and close as one would expect, given the quality.

It was Poway's day, with the Titans coming away with razor-thin victories over Mt. Carmel in both varsity races.

In girls, Poway beat the Sundevils 28-29, and Fallbrook, 26 to 31. The Poway boys edged Mt. Carmel 28-29, and beat Fallbrook 20-35. Mt. Carmel's girls beat Fallbrook 27-31 and their boys won by 23-32.

The Sundevils were weakened by illness. Two of their top five boys didn't even race.

Poway's Jessica Pound ran in a pack with Mt. Carmel's Melanie Pickett and Fallbrook's Jinna Rohde in the race's early stages

before moving away to a decisive win.

The boys race almost literally went to the wire as Mt. Carmel's Greg Nett outkicked Poway's Travis Kirtley.

Santana's Harper Scorches Lindo

One of the area's hottest runners is Santana sophomore Jaymie Harper. She had an outstanding effort in a dual meet with El Capitan on Oct. 13 at the Lindo Lake course.

Her time of 12:18 for the 2.15-mile course was the fastest ever recorded in a dual meet on that layout. The course record,

set by Grossmont's Darcy Arreola in 1983, is 11:47, but that was run in a championship meet. "She was really flying." El Cap girls coach Bill Cleves said.

El Cap won the dual 25-30, with late surges by key pack runners.

"We were ahead by a point with about a half-mile to go," Santana coach Dave Harper said. "But one of their girls (Stephanie Kindreich) made a move past two of our girls. The El Cap girls have a lot of pride, and they were definitely not taking us lightly."

El Capitan was coming off a loss to a strong West Hills squad. It was their first conference defeat in five years.

Orange Glen's Girls Emerging

Orange Glen's girls team is beginning to attract notice.

Coach Mike Cummings has a young group that is improving visibly almost day by day.

Of course, the Patriots compete in the Palomar League, the section's toughest group, and will race in Division I in the section finals, which is also very tough company.

Even in such rigorous competition, Cummings' girls have not escaped attention.

League rival Don Jones, the Rancho Bernardo coach and a careful observer of the local running scene, is impressed.

"This might be the best girls team he (Cummings) has ever had at Orange Glen," Jones said.

It's a young group. Cummings has one senior among the top nine girls. The others are all freshmen and sophomores.

Cumming is philosophical about his talent.

"I had a team like this once before," he said. "It was a boys team that was very young, and we finished fifth at CIF. But almost none of the kids returned the next year."

"This is one of the most enjoyable groups I've ever had," he said. "They seem to enjoy running. They always ask if they can go farther or if they can go harder."

"It's become a close team,

and Julius Amicho, who is Sudanese. The two seem inseparable during races, and are also roommates. At Southern Cal, their times were one second apart, although they ran in different races.

Telford says the pair is "so incredibly strong willed. They are just very determined." The two are still relative newcomers to the sport, which makes Telford think "they still have the potential for significant improvement."

They now trail Abdusalam by about a minute, but part of that differential is accounted for by Ayub's quick times.

"They are really solid two and three runners," one coach observed. "But Hoover drops off after that."

Maybe not. The four man is Sefe Almedom (from Eritrea), who Telford thinks can close the gap. "He hasn't been healthy all year," he said. "But he's an emotional runner and will have big races when it counts the most."

The next three are Nasir Abdullahi (Somalia), Mario Velazco (Mexico) and Julio Acosta (Mexico), all in their first or second year of competition.

Telford thinks they, too, will begin to make up ground at the end of the season.

Where all this is leading is a head-on collision with Scripps Ranch. They'll meet in a Western League meet at Morley on Oct. 26, again in the league finals, and again, in CIF Divison II. There are other quality teams in that division, such as Torrey Pines, but Hoover and Scripps will be the favorites.

Some might stereotype a team with a squad of Africans as a team having the benefit of natural talent.

Telford disagrees. "Except for Ayub, none of the others would probably be selected to run in his own country. This is all the end result of really hard work. They are just incredibly determined."

Actually, according to Telford, he's had to learn how to train his charges.

"It took me a while to find out how to work them," he said. "The first year can be very problematic. It depends on how healthy they are. Sometimes, they have had improper nutrition, which has led to stress fractures."

Telford is in his fifth year at Hoover. Originally from the University of Wisconsin (where

he ran one year) he decided on coaching as a mid-life career switch.

"Running got me through some real tough times," he said. "I wanted to give something back to the sport."

Hoover is now ranked third in the coaches' poll, after outrunning everybody except a great Vista squad at Southern Cal.

Fallbrook and San Pasqual.


In girls results, trailing

A number of teams were missing key personnel. Some were injured or sick, and it was also PSAT testing day.

Bonita Vista's girls were surprisingly competitive despite missing Becker and their number five girl. Ramona's girls felt the loss of their number two, Erin Kilian. La Jolla's teams were missing many athletes.

Abdusalam has emerged as the county's best runner, as he beat Vista's Trevor Sybert, Ramona's Shilo Glass, El Camino's Tom Kloos, San Pasqual's Manuel Romero and Scripps' Kevin Bowes, among others.

Those runners ran in a pack through the first mile, but Sybert

and Abdusalam edged ahead in the second mile. After the two mile mark, Sybert put on a move, but Abdusalam had the strength to win the duel, by two seconds.

Ramona's Clark won more comfortably, running the last mile by herself and winning by 10 seconds.

In other news, the Torrey Pines girls made waves despite competing half a state away.

The Falcons easily won the Division II race at San Luis Obispo, with Devon Straitiff leading the way.

What was really impressive, however, was Torrey's showing in overall results. Meet officials ran Division I and II girls together, which meant the Falcons raced head to head with powerhouse teams Peninsula and Madera. They beat both teams and Straitiff and the Falcons won the overall race.

Last year, Peninsula was second in Division I of the state meet, and had six of seven girls returning. Madera was third in Division I at state, and also had six of seven back.

It was a great team race for Torrey.

"I was out on the course," coach Brent Thorne said, "and Devon went by, followed by a pack of Peninsula girls, and then Sandi (Rabie) and a pack of our girls. I said to myself, 'what a great team race Peninsula is running,' When the runners came back, our girls had just gone bananas."

The lead pack includes freshmen Cara Rumble and Katie Cottrell and sophs Melissa Hieb and Gina Rennix. Right behind them is another group that


includes senior Stacy Maffei, sophs Laura Lawrence and Sara Alvarez, and freshmen Piper Lester and Kendra Goffredo.

West Hills to Race in Division III

West Hills will race this year in Division III when the championship meets begin, despite a story in these pages that indicated the Wolfpack would move up to Division II.

That move might only be a year away, however, as West Hills has recently seen a significant influx of students, due to an open enrollment policy. The freshman class, which does not count against enrollment for purposes of determining state divisions, numbers 700 students.

The impact of West Hills' eventual placement affects both Division II and III.

In Division II girls, West Hills would have definitely figured into the mix. Now, Torrey Pines will contend with El Capitan, Valhalla and San Pasqual. In Division III, the West Hills girls will run head-on into La Jolla, OLP, USD, Santana and Ramona. The two teams that emerge from that bunch will be contenders at state.

The West Hills boys will be a contender in Division III, going against Ramona, St. Augustine, Mission Bay, La Jolla and USD.

The individual girls race in Division III should be a dandy. West Hills frosh Alexis Rendina, Santana's Jaymie Harper, Ramona's Veronica Clark, USD's Vanessa Hanley, La Jolla's Leah Walkey and Shannon O'Connor and OLP's Michelle O'Connor and Sarah Janes all bear watching.

At Ramona, the Track is Finished, But Not Debate

Construction of a new track at Ramona High School is near completion, but the project has been anything but smooth.


Controversy has marked the project, even as Ramona Unified board members have apparently been satisfied by a report that the track is up to specs.

It was reported at one point that the oval was not a full 400 meters in length, although adminstration officials and contractors are convinced that the track is accurately laid out.

One measurement that is widely accepted is the track's width, which is 352 inches: that means nine lanes will measure a maximum of 39 inches each.

Adjustments to either measurement will be extremely difficult to make, as the oval is surrounded on three sides by a concrete sidewalk.


