CIF: Anything Can, Will, Might Happen...

has gone before. If there's one lesson to be drawn from this season, it might be: expect to be surprised.

Now, the season is turning to the big meets, the CIF Finals, followed by the State Championships in Fresno, Saturday, Nov. 26.

At those levels, things happen. Large fields spook some teams, and give others a kick.

Runners that are accustomed to running in the front suddenly find themselves struggling to keep contact with a large, fastmoving pack. Strategy can sometimes go out the window.

It has been an unpredictable season to this point for San Diego Section teams, with a number of developments that few foresaw at season's start.

One constant theme running through the season has been the strong performance of teams not necessarily considered cross country strongholds.

Hardworking teams from hardworking neighborhoods have emerged as the equal of the suburban enclaves.

Teams like Chula Vista, San Pasqual, Vista, Hoover, San Diego and others bely that whitebread cross country image.

What will happen at CIF is anybody's guess. The biggest upset would be for the meet to run completely faithful to the prerace dopesheets.

A quick preview:

Division IV:
BOYS: Coronado and

Trevor Clarke are the unquestioned class here. The real fight will be for the second state meet berth among Calvin Christian, Lincoln and Clairemont. At this level, the teams are very thin, and big swings can occur. Behind Clarke, who is running extremely well, look for Coronado's Mike Aguilar and Cheyne Jones, Tri City's Ryan Swanson, Julian's Todd Lewis and Aaron Voss, Army Navy's Jason Tullius and Robert Frailing, Clairemont's Derrick Davis, Gompers' Ajani Brown, and Lincoln's Ismail Mohammed and Tillihan Fessehai.

GIRLS: Bishop's is a big favorite. They have up-front talent, good depth for a small school, and always seem to run well in this meet. Coronado is a good bet for number two.

Marissa Hurwitz and Jessica Lunt, leaders of the respective

schools, are the best individuals. Bishop's pack should be well-placed in the top ten, and individuals such as Christian's Beth Bowler, Calvin Christian's Leslie DeJager, Clairemont's Janelle Honings and Lincoln's Theresa Bronstatter will also be in the hunt for medals.

Division III:

BOYS: Now it gets a bit tricky. Can Ramona put it all together? Can West Hills rise to the occasion? Has St. Augustine been laying low? What about Mission Bay? There are any number of scenarios. Shilo Glass and Galen Reid of Ramona, Ross Damman of University, Stewart Blain of West Hills, Jonathan Holmes, Sean Bottego and Ivan Osuna from Mission Bay, and Martin Reyes from St. Augustine are all contenders.

GIRLS: Even more competitive. Santana, West Hills, La Jolla, University, Ramona and Our Lady of Peace could finish in almost any order. University was impressive in their league final, Ramona can be unpredictable, La Jolla is strong at the top, and West Hills may have the best pack. Individually, Vee Clark is a favorite, but will

be challenged by USD's Vanessa Hanley, Santana's Jaymie Harper, and La Jolla's front three of Shannon O'Connor, Clodagh Rafferty and Leah Walkey.

This might be the most competitive division, at least in terms of being wide-open.

Division II:

BOYS: The largest division, with 23 teams jockeying for position. Scripps Ranch has been the favorite all season, but will be challenged by Hoover, Torrey Pines and fast-improving San Pasqual. There could be a darkhorse from among teams such as Point Loma, Valhalla and Mount Miguel as well. Individually, Hoover's Ayub Abdusalam is the man, but will get tested by Point Loma's Chris Werdenberg, El Camino's Tom Kloos, Grossmont's David McQuitty, San Pasqual's Manuel Romero, and the Scripps runners, led by Kevin Bowes.

GIRLS: Best bet of the meet is Torrey Pines in this division. They are the state's top-ranked team, on merit. This is one team that can withstand a bad race or two from among their pack. The fight for the second

Notes from a jampacked five days...

n the course of producing this issue, I covered seven league finals meets in the span of five days. In that 92-hour stretch, I drove over 500 miles, made over 400 exposures, and filled a notebook with results.

It began with the Eastern League on Tuesday, continued with the Western League on Wednesday, the Harbor League on Thursday, the Avocado and Palomar Leagues on Friday and finished with the Grossmont 2A and 3A Leagues on Saturday morning.

At times, it all seemed to blur together (see picture on page one) and I still have to refer to my notes to remember just how things went.

My impressions of league finals week: Winter is here:

When you live in Julian, you're just a bit more tuned to the weather trends. So far this fall, we're in a wintertime weather pattern. The conditions for racing were cool mostly, sometimes even cold. It rained during the Harbor League meet (there were snowflakes mixed with the rain when I left Julian that morning). The moisture probably quickened the Kit Carson course and probably slowed the mostly grass Grossmont course.

Most unsettling development:

The Eastern League Finals, where there was confusion about the meet date, and where two schools mistakenly didn't show up for the race. The teams were allowed to run a "make-up" race the next day, but it put a damper on the whole meet. An awards ceremony had to be cancelled, and the "make-up" race was an anticlimax.

Peaking when it counts:

Teams that didn't win dual meet titles but which nailed down championships (or cochampionships) with timely finals performances included San Diego's boys, El

Best runners' course:

Probably Kit Carson Park, although Harry Griffen Park looks like a fun course, with its twists and turns.

Best spectator course:

Harry Griffen Park, where almost the entire course is in sight from a number of vantage points.

Worst spectator course:

Any of the variations of the Morley Field dual meet course, used for the championships of the Eastern, Western and Harbor Leagues. The final half mile, where everything happens, is completely hidden from view.

Highest placing freshmen:

Granite Hills' Nicole Caster won the Grossmont 3A girls race, and Christian's Beth Bowler was second in the Harbor League girls race.

Best head-to-head races:

Devon Straitiff vs. Vee Clark in the Avocado girls; Vanessa Hanley vs. Shannon O'Connor in the Western girls; and Tom Kloos vs. Manuel Romero in the Avocado boys. I didn't personally witness it, but it must have been a good race among the three Chula Vista runners (Jason White, Ruben Carrillo and Jorge Martinez) for the Metro top spot.

Impressive solo races:

Mira Mesa's Larry Henderson and Hoover's Ayub Abdusalam ran off by themselves and had quick times. Unfortunately, they'll be in different divisions at CIF. They may meet at the Foot Locker regionals.

Wait until next year:

Henderson and Abdusalam are both juniors.

Most dominant team in their league:

The Bishop's School girls team, who took six of the first seven places in the Coastal Finals. Runner-up: Chula Vista's boys, who went 1-2-3 and put six in the top ten at Metro.

Happiest championship team:

El Capitan's girls, who were obviously thrilled and ecstatic about their achievement. Runner-up: USD's girls.

Coolest awards acceptance:

Mount Miguel's boys team, who snaked down the aisle and came up with a team chant on their way to pick up their medals.

It didn't officially count, but...

University's girls ran strongly in the Western Finals and took the meet, although it officially did nothing to resolve a three-way tie for the championship among USD, La Jolla and the Academy of Our Lady of Peace. The three will meet again in CIF Division III.

A confrontation that didn't happen:
One sub-plot of the Western Finals boys race was a meeting of St. Augustine and Mission Bay. The outcome of the race would have had implications for CIF Division III, but it didn't come off. Mission Bay's ace, Jonathan Holmes, didn't finish the race, while St. Augustine didn't even enter a full team, putting their freshmen and sophomores in the junior varsity race.

Everybody wants to compare:

Vista's and Torrey Pines' girls teams.

They were in separate races, but raced on the same course on the same day, so it was easy to compare the times. The result: way too close to call.

In a dual meet, one team would have won by 27-29, and the team times (first five) were just 10 seconds apart. It's been like that all year for these two excellent teams.

If you're interested in splitting the thinnest of hairs, check the results for yourself.

Another comparison:

Involves the Grossmont 2A and 3A girls championship teams: Valhalla and El Capitan. They were in the *same* race, but were scored separately at the Grossmont Finals. In a dual, the teams would have been separated by *one* point. Again, too close to call. The two teams are among the contenders in CIF Division II.

V is for Victory:

Two teams won league championships in both boys and girls: Vista and Valhalla.

Racing under the worst of circumstances:
Julian's teams were rocked by the news of
a tragic auto accident involving friends and a
former track teammate less than 24 hours
before the Coastal Finals. The runners,
understandably, were flat, although most ran
representative races. Most off was Aaron
Voss, who had beaten all but the top two
runners in the dual meets. He finished 17th.

Most underrated league:

The Western, especially the girls teams.
The coaches' poll has basically ignored
University, La Jolla and OLP all year. Does
anybody really think that four Grossmont
League teams are better than University and
La Jolla?

Not necessarily underrated, but deserving of more respect:

Coronado. As a Division IV school, they aren't really a plausible candidate to be ranked in the county's top ten, but Coronado has one of the best Division IV boys teams to come out of this area in years. They are currently ranked fifth in the state.

Most depth:

Torrey Pines' and Vista's girls. Torrey's eight and nine girls were 14th and 15th in the Avocado Final. Vista's number eight girl was 20th in the Palomar Final.

Least depth:

Lincoln's boys team. When all there, they are a serious contender for a state meet berth in Division IV. If a runner is missing, they're non-scoring.

Fashion statement:


Cold weather gear was spotted at the Grossmont Finals. Some of the Valhalla girls wore full-length spandex, while Santana's Jaymie Harper started with gloves on her hands. About 2/3 into the race, she tossed the gloves aside in a Keinoesque gesture.

Best awards ceremony:

The Grossmont League. The ceremony was held in a small ampitheater, followed the final races closely, spread out lots of awards, and was intelligently hosted and well-run. It put a good spin on the day, and was a fitting end to the week.

Only regrets:

Just two: too much fast food; and that I couldn't make it to the Metro or Coastal Finals.

berth will be close, among Valhalla, El Capitan, Scripps Ranch, San Marcos and Point Loma. Torrey's Devon Straitiff has a shot at winning the individual title, but will get challenges from among Valhalla's Stephanie Nelle, Escondido's Kelly Peterson, Carlsbad's Jessica Anderson, San Pasqual's Christy Beckman, Scripps Ranch's Sarah Schmidt, and El Cap's Larissa Gregerson and Jenny Card. Straitiff's teammates, especially Sandi Rabie and Carrie Hemerick, will

also be in that group. Division I:

BOYS: Vista and Chula Vista have been on a collision course all year, and both seem to be peaking at the right time. If one or both falter, however, quality teams such as Mt. Carmel, San Dieguito, Poway, Rancho Bernardo, San Diego and Bonita Vista would be more than happy to step forward.

Individually, Mira Mesa's Larry Henderson is the logical favorite, but challenges will come from among Vista's Trevor Sybert and Jason Land, Bonita Vista's Aaron Smith, Poway's Travis Kirtley, RB's Jeff Meis-

ner, Mt. Carmel's Greg Nett, Sweetwater's Jose Barajas, San Diego's Gabriel Murillo and San Dieguito's Chris Gabriel. It's going to be a quality top ten.

GIRLS: A tough, tough field. Vista's team is currently ranked second in the state and is equal in strength to Torrey Pines. They'll face considerably stiffer competition in their division, however, as Poway, Bonita Vista, Fallbrook, Mt. Carmel, Rancho Bernardo, Orange Glen, Granite Hills and Mira Mesa will all bring some credentials to the fight. Best bet is for Bonita Vista and Poway to duke it out for the second state meet team slot, although anything can and will happen. The competition for the five individual qualifying state meet berths will be fierce, with Fallbrook's Jinna and Sharon Rohde and Tricia Mattson, Granite Hills' Nicole Caster, Sweetwater's Jessica Cabrera, Mira Mesa's Mariel Gray, and Mt. Carmel's Melanie Pickett all competing with the leaders of whichever team is left out from among Poway, Bonita Vista and Vista.

Bonita's Claire Becker has missed some training time this fall, which might open the door for a challenge from Poway's

Jessica Pound. Vista's Sonia Rodriguez, Angela Shea and Fatima El-Farrah, Poway's Ann Koscki and Lisa Vasek and BV's Meghann Phillips and Rosie Costello will all be part of that competitive group already listed. With so much talent in one race, something unexpected is bound to occur.

Sorry, No Dual, Frosh/Soph Results...

San Diego's Boys Rebound, Mira Mesa's Girls Dominate

he Eastern League Finals were just a bit, uh, unusual. Two teams missed the meet, inadvertently, and the competition was spread out over two days.

First, the race was run as scheduled without the missing schools. The Patrick Henry and Serra teams then ran a time trial early the next afternoon, before the Western League Finals, and their results were then collated.

It didn't affect the team or individual championships, but it cast a shadow on the entire meet. Awards had to be postponed, and the winning teams couldn't celebrate until all the results were in. The Henry and Serra runners had the worst of it, running unchallenged races against unseen opponents.

Mira Mesa's girls, led by Mariel Gray, had no problem winning the

girls title to go with their dual meet crown. The Marauders had a good pack, as Alisa Thwing was second, Jamie Terrel fifth, Jennifer Grooms sixth, Jessica Grooms ninth, and Heather Madsen 11th.

Gray ran 15:55 for the 2.55-mile Morley Field course. Point Loma's girls, led by Lea Hitt and Melina Rodriguez, were second.

Mira Mesa's Larry Henderson ran alone and clocked an outstanding 14:56 for the just under three mile course.

The boys team title went to San Diego, who got revenge for their dual meet loss to Point Loma earlier in the season.


"They were really fired up," San Diego coach Eduardo Ramos said of his team. "They wanted to prove something to themselves. They talked it over among themselves and they came through."

Only 21 seconds separated the Cavers' first five runners, including Gabriel Murillo (3rd), Noe Alvarez (4th), Juan Jose Martinez (7th), Alfonso Alvarez (9th) and Daniel Girmay (10th).

"I think my kids run better in big meets," Ramos said. "When there are more runners, they find their spot."

"I knew they could do it," he said of the win. "But I was still shocked. Anything is possible."

The Cavers and Point Loma ended up as co-champions. The Pointers ran strongly all year, led by senior Chris Werdenberg, who was second to Henderson on this day.







La Jolla's Clodagh Rafferty and Shannon O'Connor pushed Hanley hard, but Hanley prevailed and her teammates came up big.

Kristen Epperson, Stephanie Fischer, Erin Shea and Amy Morrison all finished in the top twelve and Uni won the meet.

Chula Vista Boys, Bonita Vista Girls Dominate Finals

n the surface, everything seemed normal at the Metro Championships. Chula Vista's boys and Bonita Vista's girls were in control, and the expected big names were at the top.

In reality, there was a bit of anxiety about the outcome. Bonita Vista's Claire Becker, the San Diego Section's best girl runner, hadn't run a race in more than a month. She has been shelved with patellar tendinitis, although she has been able to train lightly.

Becker won the girls race, running the 2.3 mile Southwestern College course in 14:00, and showed just a bit of rust.

"She was 14 seconds slower than last year," Bonita Vista coach Ian Cumming said.
"She is not in as good of condition."

"But, she went right out front, and built a lead," Cumming said. Best of all, according to Cumming, there were no significant aftereffects. No soreness, "nothing," he said.

Becker's teammates, Rosie Costello and Meghann Phillips, were second and third in the race, and the Barons won easily, also clinching the overall league title.

Hilltop's Patt Beltran and Chula Vista's Yolonda Montalvo rounded out the top five.

Bonita Vista, with Becker back, is still a top contender in the CIF Division I meet.

Even Vista coach Paul Kinder is wary.

"Bonita Vista worries me," he said. "Any time you put that number one up there (where Becker may finish), and can back it up with other strong runners, you've got to be concerned."

Chula's boys were even more dominant, also sweeping the first three places and putting six in the top ten.

"Our boys are peaking," Chula Vista coach Art Johnson said. The Spartans are cofavorites, along with Vista, in the CIF Division I race, and their performance in this meet did nothing to change anyone's mind.

In the league meet, Jason White, Jorge Martinez and Ruben Carrillo ran as a group, and the race boiled down to who had the best kick. White, a 1:56 half-miler, won that contest, and clocked 16:06 for the 3.1-mile course. Martinez ran 16:08, and Carrillo did 16:09.

"It's not a fast course," Johnson said.
"Those times are pretty good."

By comparison, Carrillo won last year's meet, at the same site, in 16:25, just before he led the Spartans to the CIF large-school title.

Next closest finisher to the top three, 22 seconds back, was Bonita Vista's Aaron Smith.

The Spartans also placed Jose Ramirez,
Matt Dunn and Larry Romero in the top ten.

The Spartan girls and Bonita Vista's boys were runners-up, while Sweetwater teams took third in both races.





Grossmont's David McQuitty, running by himself for the entire race, was the 3A and overall race winner, running 16:25 for the 3.1-miles.



"We've been working really hard," Calvin coach Linda Marcus said. "Our guys definitely peaked today (at league)."

It was supposed to be an off year at Calvin, after last year's top two runners left the school. A pair of freshman runners, Matt Gailey and Will Wilgenburg, shored up the pack and were ninth and tenth in the finals.

Tri City's Ryan Swanson outraced Julian's Todd Lewis to win the individual title.

Bishop's girls left no doubt. Marissa Hurwitz, after missing a full year of competition, returned in a big way, running the "new" CIF course at Morley Field in 15:53.

She won easily and led her teammates to a virtual sweep of the top spots. The Knights went 1-2-3-5-6-7 to rout the league. Only Calvin's Leslie DeJager broke up the pack.

Bishop's is a solid favorite to win the CIF Division IV girls race. Calvin's boys now rank as a contender to nab a state meet slot.
