NEWS ROUNDUP:

Final invites invite pause in rush to season's end

After this, the final week-end of big invitational meets, you'll almost be able to hear the collective exhale of coaches and athletes.

It's a sigh of relief, as the season enters the most critical phase of all: the countdown to the final meets.

The breath being blown out is the final hard puff before hunkering down to the essence of the season: tuning up for the championship meets.

All the fast times and all the honors garnered to date will be quickly overshadowed by dramatic developments yet unknown.

Almost everybody is on the same page at this time of year: keeping the runners in one piece.

A number of coaches, in fact, have curtailed appearances in meets to keep the focus on the end of the year.

One coach of a CIF contender is considering scrubbing his team's annual appearance at Mt. SAC.

Another coach is considering dropping his entry in this week-end's Kit Carson Invitational, looking ahead to a critical dual.

Last week's Southern California Invitational felt the impact of a number of teams that just plain wanted to stay home and rest.

Every coach is concerned with his team's collective physical and mental health.

"I think I'll back off on the training just a bit," Santana coach Dave Harper said.

"I wanted to give my kids a day off," Orange Glen coach Mike Cummings said about his team's non-appearance at Southern Cal.

The result of all this has been a disquieting buildup.

There's been some news, of course. A number of teams have

had critical dual meet show-downs. Invitationals have still made the headlines (figuratively, anyway).

But the overall sensation is that something bigger is just around the corner.

Call it the calm before the storm.

The news:

SOUTHERN CAL:

There seem to be three things that can be counted on at the Southern California Invitational.

One is that Vista's teams will be impressive.

Two is that a great out of town team will be impressive.

Three is that college entrance exams will steal away a number of good athletes.

The format of the meet is a series of races, with each team entering just one athlete.

Number one runners vie with other number one runners, etc., through seven positions, and the the times are later added together for team awards.

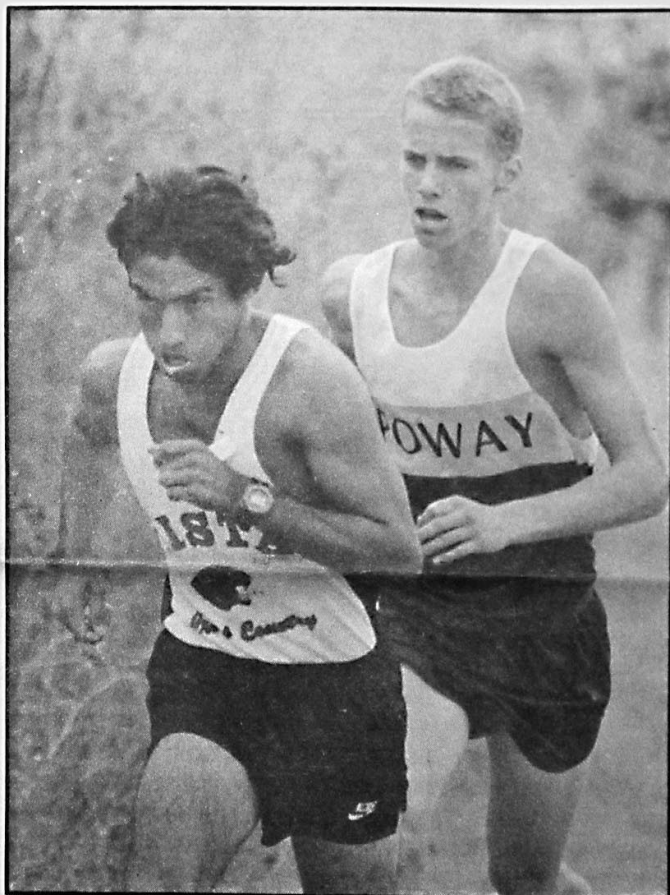
Vista had the best overall boys team, with four runners among the eight fastest overall.

In fact, Vista's first five runners averaged 17:08 for the 3.16-mile course. Only four non-Vista athletes ran faster than that during the competition.

Fastest Panther was junior Steve Ketcham, who is having a good year. Jason Land, Joe Briceno and Gonzalo Garcia also had good efforts.

"The Vista runners are like machines," one observer said in admiration. The Panthers took three firsts, three seconds and third in the seven races.

Yucaipa's boys had the next best collection of times, followed closely by Poway. Titan senior Travis Kirtley was missing on the day of the race (taking the S.A.T.), but came out in the late

afternoon on the day before to run a solo time trial. Meet officials allowed that time to be counted as part of Poway's total team time.

The course, slightly long and with a lot of soft sand, was not fast. Only four boys, including Kirtley, broke 17 minutes.

The girls races were dominated, completely, by powerhouse Yucaipa. They had individual winners in each of the seven finals. The team is ranked number one in the state in Division II.

In a mild upset, Scripps Ranch's girls team had a faster team time than Vista.

Vista was paced by senior and team leader Sonia Rodriguez

who had a PR on the course of 14:56, behind only the efforts of Yucaipa's Kim Welsh and Mindy Brown.

Scripps used a strong first four that included Sarah Schmidt, Kristina Stasko, Emily McFarland and Kelly Grimes, to pace the local entries.

Overall, the meet did not feature as strong a field of runners as in 1994.

Teams such as Rancho Bernardo, Rancho Buena Vista, Hoover, Orange Glen, and others, were missing.

For a variety of reasons, athletes such as Clodagh Rafferty, Veronica Clark, Jinna

From the editor ...



Each issue of this publication is an adventure unto itself. There is never such a thing as a routine schedule, and we are still in the process of experimenting with content and format.

Sometimes, things go wrong. Our fax machine ran out of toner right about the time we were wrapping up the last issue.

No problem, right? Just buy more toner, right? Not so fast. I spent about 90 minutes on the phone, much of it on hold, and most of it on long distance, trying to locate the exact product I needed.

I checked every computer store, every electronics store, every office supply chain in the area. No luck. I called the dealer and was first told that they had no information on local dealers, and that I would have to order direct from the factory. I asked that the toner be sent on next day air, UPS, to insure a minimal down time on the fax, which is a vital link for receiving results.

Well, the dealer messed up on the order, and sent it regular ground UPS, which meant a delay of about a week more than it should have taken. I was reassured, however, that they didn't charge me for the next-day air service. Thanks for nothing, I thought. Then I found out that they did know of a local dealer that stocked the toner. I called them, found out they had it in stock, and that it was half the price that I was being charged by the dealer!

Of course, I picked up the toner the next day, driving an hour out of my way, drove home and found that the UPS had dropped off the toner from the dealer.

Meanwhile, while waiting, I kept my fax on, and hoped that the machine would have enough memory to store most of the incoming info. As it happened, the memory filled up in no time (it was only about 20 pages), and I missed any number of calls.

If you faxed in information, and don't see it printed in these pages, then I apologize. I now have a few years supply of toner in stock, and the fax is up and running (and

cranking out pages of results).

How important is the fax to my operation? I called one coach over the weekend to get some meet results, talked over 30 minutes (on long distance), and got a few pages of information. A couple of days later, when I got the fax back in operation, the machine's memory kicked in, and printed out many pages of copy.

One of those pages, sent over the phone lines in about 30 seconds, contained all the information that it had taken me over 30 minutes to obtain on the phone.

Ah, the curse of technology.

Update on those freshman girls...

Last issue's article on outstanding frosh girl runners needs some updating.

Several more talents have emerged, and a couple of the runners have dramatically improved.

University's Courtney Baird has been sensational in recent weeks. When the season began, Uni coach Rob Winters was thinking that Baird would help his team, but she has turned into a very good runner.

At the St. Augustine Invitational, Baird was second to teammate Julie Ott, beating good runners like Jessica Lunt and Marissa Hurwitz.

A few days later, in a dual meet, Ott and Baird went one-two on none other than Scripps Ranch and Sarah Schmidt. Pretty decent running. Baird ran 18:28 for the Morley 3-mile course, five seconds behind Ott.

Another fast improver is Chula Vista's Aida Garcia. Last week, she won the girls Division I varsity race at San Luis Obispo, running 19:33 for the 3.1-mile course.

San Marcos has two good frosh talents. Besides Alana Bochiechio, mentioned in the last issue, the Knights have Kelly Kodadek, who ran number two for the team when they defeated Ramona in a dual recently.

Danielle Magante, a full-blooded Sioux Indian, is leading the Serra girls team as a frosh. She is the daughter of a career Marine that is stationed in the area. Serra coach Jim Richards is hoping that the parent's duty assignment lasts for a few years.

Warner Union, a brand new school located in Warner Springs, has a find in ninth-grader Arielle Damron. She is rapidly catching on to the sport, and this week won a four-way meet in competition with a number of other

quality girl runners. She is improving so fast that she could be a contender for a state meet berth at CIF. Warner is a Division IV school.

As the year winds up, more frosh will emerge from obscurity and come to the fore. That's the nature of the sport.

Correct information is our policy...

In show business, it is said that publicity is like breath. It is better that it be bad, than there be none at all.

In our two sports, it is quite the opposite. If our results aren't correct, then they are next to useless.

Despite our best efforts, mistakes creep in. One area that is especially hard to keep up on is names.

A quick look through any of our issues will show that we publish literally hundreds of names. Many of the names are copied directly from finish boards at meets, which are usually comprised of those stick-on name tags.

When you see meets in operation, you'll always find a few coaches hurriedly scrawling names on those tags at the last second. My accuracy is at the mercy of those coaches, and I can only hope that the coach can remember not only how to correctly spell each of his athletes' names, but that his handwriting is also legible. In one instance last year, I identified Melissa Carter as Melissa Cortez.

There is no practical way to double-check the spelling of each and every name, and if you see some unusual, or creative, versions of names, you'll know what's up.

That is not to say that we don't want to be correct.

To that end:

In our last issue, Kearny's standout soph was identified as Eric Nielson. In fact, the correct name is Erik Nealson.

Ramona's good soph girl runner is Sarah Shepherd. Not Shepard. Or Shephard.

Poway's soph standout girl is Hollie Babione. I have seen a number of versions of her name.

Escondido's talented running family includes sisters Lanele Cox and Shawnele Cox.

Poway's best frosh girl is Merideth Nespor.

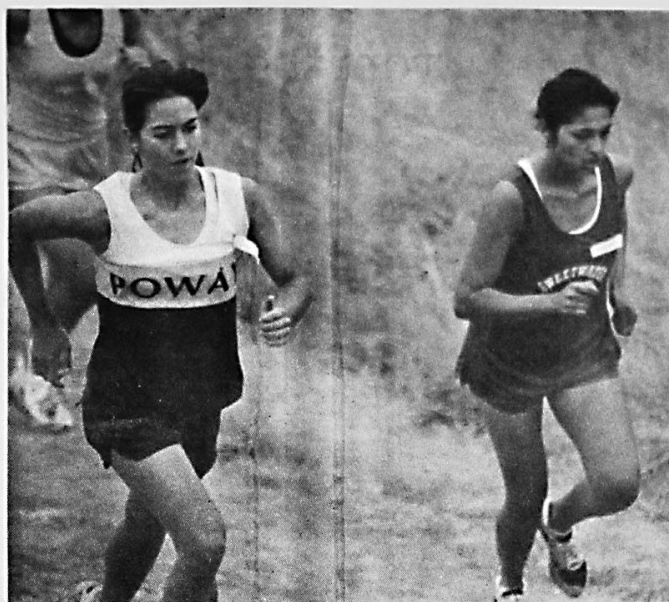

News Roundup

Rohde, Shannon Kilian, Galen Reid, Ryan Coughlin and Scott Batiuk did not race for their respective teams. Most were taking college entrance exams.

Last year's boys Number One race was almost a who's who of the local area's big guns, with Ayub Abdusalam, Trevor Sybert, Tom Kloos, Shilo Glass, Manuel Romero, Kevin Bowes, Jeff Meisner, Aaron Smith, Travis Kirtley and Adrian Ramirez all in attendance.

SAN LUIS OBISPO:

Torrey Pines' girls won the Division II team championship at Cal Poly last week, paced by Devon Straitiff's 19:30 for 3.1 miles.

Runner-up in the race was Torrey's Jaclyn Nolan.

Chula Vista's girls were second to Peninsula in the Division I race. Chula frosh Aida Garcia won that race, in 19:33.

The Chula Vista boys were fourth in Division I, and were paced by junior Adrian Ramirez. His 16:25 for fifth was the fastest by any San Diego area athlete in the meet.

Torrey Pines' boys were second in Division II, and junior Charley Hulsey was second in the race, at 16:40.

CENTRAL PARK:

The big news at the Central Park Invitational, held at Huntington Beach, was the impressive run by Hoover's Ayub Abdusalam.

Abdusalam, sharpening his big race skills for more serious efforts to come, ran the 3.0-mile course in 15:09 to win the Division I race. He was named Athlete of the Meet for his efforts. This comes on the heels of his impressive win in the large schools race at Stanford.

Abdusalam said that his main focus in the invitionals this year is learning to run a fast first mile, and "continuing after that." The Hoover senior had a great cross country season last year, but was left in the blocks at Fresno. This year, he hopes, will be different.

The Chula Vista boys, competing in Division II, were fourth. Adrian Ramirez was unable to run, and the Spartans were paced by Jose Ramirez, who ran 15:59.

La Jolla's girls team were second in the Division II team competition, trailing Los Alamitos. Fastest area runner was Chula Vista frosh Aida Garcia, who ran the 3.0-miles in 18:46. La Jolla's fastest was Clodagh Rafferty, who was timed in 19:32.

ST. AUGUSTINE:

This meet, designed for the area's smaller schools to get into the spotlight, saw good efforts by the St. Augustine and Coronado boys teams and the University girls.

The Saints, with a young and developing team, narrowly edged Coronado, which is a Division IV power.

Islander Trevor Clarke won the race in 16:29 over the Morley Field layout (roughly the same as the Footlocker Nationals course). He beat Clairemont's Derrick Davis by two seconds. Madison's Nick Hamlin, who blazed

away early, did not finish.

Clairemont has emerged as a strong Division IV team, and Davis' improvement is a key reason.

University's girls were led by Julie Ott and frosh Courtney Baird, who were one-two in the race. Trailing them were Bishop's Marissa Hurwitz and Coronado's Jessica Lunt, who was not at full health.

The meet functions as a sort of Division IV CIF preview, although a few Division III entries usually dominate.

Reading the fine print, Coronado and Clairemont emerge as the CIF Division IV favorites in the boys team race, although a missing and mysterious Holtville team might have something to say about that. Whichever team emerges as the Southern Conference champ (Calvin Christian?) could also be a factor.

In CIF Division IV girls, Coronado and Bishop's remain as the favorites. Any challenger would have to seriously up their level to contend.

Races for individual state qualifying slots in both boys and girls seems competely wide open, with numerous contenders.

DUALS:

Key duals were held in almost every league:

Grossmont North:

El Capitan and West Hills hooked up in a great boys dual.

El Cap wound up with a 22-34 margin, to take control of the dual-meet part of the league title (with the finals to decide 2/3 of the championship). Despite the score, it was a close and exciting race.

El Cap girls coach Bill Cleves wrote that it was the "best team race I've seen in awhile."

It was 28-28 at the mile, at 1.5 miles and at two miles. El Cap's runners edged away in the final 1.2 miles, taking spots 2 through 5 behind the Wolfpack's Dustin Diaz.

After Diaz and El Cap's Danny Sanchez, "a pack of the

next ten was grouped within five seconds of each other until the last 1200," according to Cleves.

"West Hills has the best young group of kids in the county," Cleves said. "And I think El Cap's boys are a little underrated."

Grossmont South:

Valhalla's teams are unchanged in this league.

Helix was seen as a possible contender at the start of the year, but Valhalla just has too much.

The boys team, with a 20-second pack, one through five, had little trouble with the Highlanders.

The Valhalla girls, despite running without standouts Julia Roysdon and Elaine Lassen and with a sub-par Andrea Clemons, also won handily.

Falcons Tyler Mack, Bill McKee and Abduljalil Adam took the next three places to win the meet.

The Torrey girls, in their best meet of the year, had a surprisingly easy win over Ramona, 20-35. Devon Straitiff beat Veronica Clark by 25 seconds, and Jaclyn Nolan was third. The key to the win was Torrey's pack, running together better than at any time

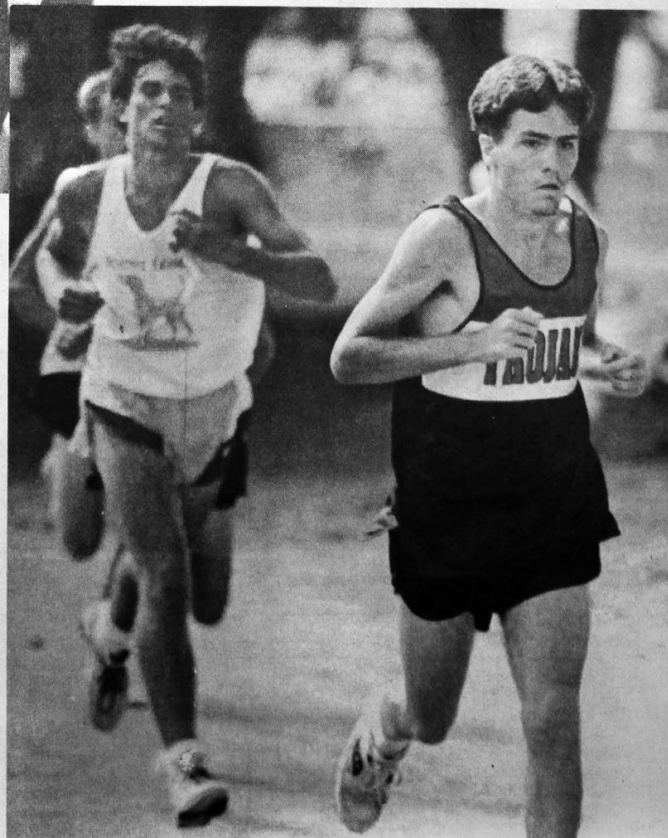
