ROUNDUP:
Series of
Finals
Begins

The last of the dual meet action takes place today (November 3), and the focus of San Diego area high school cross country will then be squarely upon a week of league championship meets.

League finals are scheduled on every day of the week, beginning Monday (for a complete schedule, see page four) when the Southern Conference teams get together at Morley Field.

It all comes to a climax on Friday, when three meets are scheduled.

The last bits of unfinished dual-meet business were completed this week, with the two top-ranked girls teams, Vista and Orange Glen, finally squaring off on Friday.


Also this week, the La Jolla and Scripps Ranch girls teams met on Thursday (results too late to be included here).

Great races were the order of the day at the last round of invitationals, both at Mt. SAC and at Kit Carson, with a number of significant developments for teams that jockeyed for position heading down the stretch.

Briefly, the news:

The Individual Sweepstakes
Boys race saw the best three
boys from the San Diego Section
take on many of the best from
around the state.

Yreka's Aaron Gillen won the race over the hilly, 3.0-mile course, in the meet's fastest time of 15:05, and he was closely followed by Mira Mesa's Larry Henderson (15:16), Hoover's Ayub Abdusalam (15:17), and



The Girls Division I race at the Kit Carson Invitational was an all-star affair. At the mile mark, the front pack included **Devon Straitiff (Torrey Pines)**, **Sarah Wilkins (Rancho Bernardo)**, **Kristina Stasko (Scripps Ranch)**, **Sarah Schmidt (Scripps Ranch)**, **Larissa Gregerson (El Capitan)**, and **Emily McFarland (Scripps Ranch)**. Positioned just behind the front-runners at this point was the Vista team, which won the race. The race featured the top seven ranked girls teams in the county, four of which were ranked in the state's top ten.

Grossmont's David McQuitty (15:29), who took the next three places.

As the race developed, a large group of runners that included all of the above ran the relatively flat first mile in 4:41, but Gillen began to pull ahead on a switchback hill section. By the halfway mark, he was building a slight lead over Henderson, who was never able to get back into contention.

Henderson was able to maintain an edge over Abdusalam, another local who is having a fine year. McQuitty was fourth, also with a good effort.

The boys team sweepstakes saw the two top-ranked local teams, Vista and Poway, compete with a great group from around the state.

Poway, led by Travis Kirtley, Jake McNeely and Jesse Davis, was 11th in the stellar field, while Vista's team was 16th. Vista coach Craig Balsley
later said that car trouble had
caused runners Steve Ketcham
and Joe Briceno to miss most of
the previous night's rest. Both
had sub-par efforts in the race.

Poway's girls team might have had their best race of the year in a varsity race, with Jessica Pound, Lisa Vasek, Ann Koscki and Merideth Nespor all finishing in the top five. Pound was timed in 19:43.

La Jolla's girls, competing in the Division III team sweepstakes race, had a team time nearly as fast as Poway's group, despite running without Leah Walkey or Michelle O'Connor. The Vikings were paced by Shelby Stanger's 19:43.

Fastest time by a San Diego
Section girl in the meet was a
19:21 by Fallbrook's Tricia
Mattson. Helix frosh Natalie
Sullivan and University's Julie
Ott both had 19:35 clockings in
the competition.

Other good team efforts

were registered by Fallbrook's boys team and Coronado's boys team (seventh in the Division IV team sweepstakes race), led by Trevor Clarke's 16:35.

After Henderson, Abdusalam and McQuitty, many of the fastest times by locals came in that loaded Division I team sweepstakes race, with Kirtley (16:06), Vista's Jason Land (16:10) and Gonzalo Garcia (16:18) and Poway's McNeely (16:24) and Davis (16:30) all running well.

KIT CARSON:

The race of the day at this meet was the Division I girls race. It featured the top seven locally ranked teams in a clash for local bragging rights.

When the dust had cleared, Vista's girls were atop the heap, edging out Orange Glen and Scripps Ranch.

Behind those three were Torrey Pines, Valhalla, Rancho Bernardo and El Capitan.

From the editor:

Finals: Always unpredictable...

As this area's athletes prepare for the series of season-ending meets that decide just about everything, it's time to remember that anything can, will and has happened.

There will be surprises, there will be upsets, there will be great efforts from heretofore discounted teams and runners.

Somewhere, probably, there is a team that has been quietly building to a crescendo, with athletes on the mend from previous injuries, with everything clicking into place at just the right time.

Somewhere, and you can bet on it, there is a team that is beginning to fray just a bit, after a series of hard races. Can they hold on to their form for just a bit longer?

Somewhere, a coach is performing brain surgery on his athletes, building (or restoring) their confidence, which is so vital at this time of year.

On some campuses, a key runner is about to emerge that can make a difference. On one team, it could be a front-runner about to raise their level of excellence. On another team, a member of the pack might be ready to close the gap on the team's time-spread.

Teams that enjoy the services of two or three standout runners are keeping their fingers crossed in the hopes that their fourfive runners will somehow come through.

Some individual runners, who have been pushing the limits on the number of activities in which they can participate, will focus on training and racing at the last minute, and will make a jump in stature.

Some teams are still assembling their various parts, adding key ingredients at almost the last minute (La Jolla, with Leah Walkey; and Torrey Pines, with Danielle Valentino; among others).

There are more than a few mystery teams out there. How do they stack up?

How good are Chula Vista's boys and girls teams? Are they CIF threats?

What about Monte Vista's boys? They haven't been seen at full strength in a 3.1-mile

They then came within a point of Valhalla in a dual -- are they that good?

Where does Oceanside's young boys team fit in the CIF picture? A Division III team, Oceanside has been competing against Division II schools all year.

What's up with St. Augustine's boys, University's girls and both Ramona teams? For a variety of reasons and circumstances, none of those squads has ever put their best seven together on the line in a big meet this year.

The most mysterious team of all is Holtville, a Division IV school that is not an official part of any local league. Will they show up with a strong boys team at CIF? Team ace Miguel Ramirez is now eligible, but what kind of team backs him up?

For the answers to these and many other questions: stay tuned. But don't be surprised by anything!

What's news:

Garner double highlights local Jr. Olympics efforts

It took a while for word to reach our offices, but there were a number of outstanding efforts by local athletes in the Junior Olympics National Championships, held late in July at San Jose City College.

The highlights:

Morse's Lana Garner had a great double in the 400 and 800 meters.

Running in the Young Women division, Garner was fourth in the 800 meters in a personal record of 2:15.57 (she ran a 2:26.6 during the regular high school season).

She followed that with 54.53 in the 400, another PR, which was good for second in that event. That mark would be the third fastest ever recorded by a San Diego-area high school girl, using the Union-Tribune's 1995 Prep Track & Field Guide as a resource. Garner won the CIF championship in the 400 last spring, and had a best during the prep season of 55.06.

Garner's 800 mark would rank right behind the 1995 CIF champ (Vanessa Hanley of University, who ran 2:15.15), on the yearly best marks list. The Morse flash is currently a senior, and is enjoying a good cross-country season.

Montgomery's Reggie DePass scored a PR in the 110 high hurdles, clocking 14.44 (with a

legal 0.5-meters-per-second breeze), for second place in the intermediate boys race.

That mark puts DePass, just a sophomore last year, third on the yearly list.

Most impressive of all was Monique Henderson, who runs for the MLK Blasters.

Competing in the Midget Girls division (for 11-12 year olds), Henderson won two national championships and tied a meet record.

She ran the 200 in 25.14 (with a legal 0.8 mps aiding breeze), and also clocked 57.14 in the 400, which tied the meet record (57.0 hand time). Henderson is still several years away from high school, but her times would have ranked her third in the county in both events.

Local alums in Cross Country action...

Around the country, we've spotted these efforts in cross country by area grads:

Milena Glusac (Fallbrook) ran 17:37, for fifth place, in the Washington Invitational at Seattle, Sept. 23. She was the second finisher from the University of Oregon.

Alisa Nicodemus (Grossmont) ran 13:14 for 2.0 miles in the Crown Hurricane Invitational in Tulsa on Sept. 9. She competes for the University of Arkansas.

Brian Keim (San Pasqual), now at Baylor, ran 26:54 for 8K in the Baylor Invitational on Sept. 15, and is running number one for his school.

Mark Hauser (St. Augustine), at Wisconsin, clocked 24:49 for 8K at the Illinois State Invitational on Sept. 15. He is Wisconsin's fifth man.

Dave Levy (Mission Bay) ran 23:51 for 8K in the Jock's Nitch Southern Stampede on Sept. 16 in Joplin, Missouri. He is at Arkansas, running number seven.

Claire Becker (Bonita Vista) is at Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo, and ran 19:03 for 5K in the Fresno Invitational at Woodward Park, on Sept. 23.

Melanie Hand (Fallbrook) ran 18:42 in that same meet, and the pair helped Poly to an easy team win. Hand was Poly's number three, and Becker was the sixth runner.

Lesley Noll-Mayne (Mt. Carmel) ran 18:34 for 5K in the Riverside Invitational of Sept. 23, taking second in the race. She runs for Asics TW.

Michele Cox (Escondido), now at the University of San Diego, won the UCSD Invite on Sept. 9 at Morley Field, running 19:28 for 5K. She also was fifth in the Riverside Invite on Sept. 23, running 19:03 for 5K.

Eric Ricketts (Hilltop), now at Chico State, was second in the Stanislaus Invitational in Modesto on Sept. 9, running 25:35 for 8K.

UCLA features a number of former San Diego stars, including Mebrahtom Keflezighi (San Diego), Devin Elizondo (Mission Bay), and Kevin Bowes (Scripps Ranch).

Another ranked team, Santana, was in the Division II field.

There was so much highoctane talent in the Division I race that one coach compared it to a CIF final.

Another coach disagreed. "It's better than a CIF race," he said.

A third coach pointed out that five of the teams had been ranked statewide.

In a vintage year for good girls teams in this area, it was a rare opportunity to see the best go head-to-head.

Vista's team put together a good pack, with Sonia Rodriguez leading the way as she has all year.

Torrey's Devon Straitiff won the race in 15:24 over the 2.5-mile Kit Carson course, with Rodriguez second in 15:33.

The Panthers' Fatima El-Farrah (5th, in 15:51) and Noelle Magana (11th, in 16:14) also were key as was the fine support by the four-five runners, Brooke Schroeder and Mary Blasius.

Orange Glen's girls ran a great pack race (six girls in 43 seconds) and set up a great rematch for the final dual meet of the season. If you scored this meet as a dual, Vista would have won by a single point.

Scripps Ranch used a super-

strong first four to take a close third in the race, while Torrey Pines was strengthened by the return of key runner Danielle Valentino (out all season with a tendon injury prior to this race).

Valhalla, in fifth, was hurt by the absence of team ace Julia Roysdon, who suffered a soccer injury just days before the meet. Plugging a healthy Roysdon into Valhalla's team time would have put them right behind Vista, so her absence was a key element.

In the boys Division I team race, Torrey Pines emerged as the CIF Division II favorite after a strong effort here. They tied fourth-ranked Mt. Carmel and won the meet on a tie-breaker (fastest sixth man). The Falcons were led by Charley Hulsey and Tyler Mack, who both clocked 16:22.

In the Division II boys race, Ramona dominated, with James Adams (16:20) and Galen Reid (16:22) going one-two. Reid narrowly edged out Scripps Ranch's Brent Bolton (also 16:22). A key for Ramona was good efforts by pack members Jorge Ramos and Tim Miller. Ramos was 6th in 16:58, and Miller was 11th in 17:20.

DUALS:

The biggest showdown was at Guajome Park last Friday, when Poway's boys beat Vista, 26-29, ending a long string of dual meet successes for the Panthers.


The dual win for Poway was significant, coming both on Vista's home course and on the heels of Poway's better showing at Mt. SAC.

"It was the most exciting boys dual I've ever coached," Poway mentor Dan Schaitel said later. The two teams ran evenly, sparring back and forth, until the final half mile when Titan runners Kirtley, McNeely, Sanderson and Dalrymple made a push.

Kirtley and McNeely went one-two in the race, running 17:04 and 17:08 on the slowish course (3.16 miles and very sandy footing). Sanderson and Dalrymple were key ingredients, finishing ahead of Ketcham, Vista's fourth man on this day.

"Our guys wanted it a little bit more," Schaitel said.

The two teams will continue to butt heads for at least two more meets, at the Palomar finals and in Division I of the CIF meet. They could conceivably both advance to state, which would make this a best out of

five series between the two rivals.

In the Grossmont North, Santana's girls decisively beat a not-full-strength El Capitan team, 22-34, also last Friday.

El Cap pulled out all the stops, however, sending Larissa Gregerson hard after Jaymie Harper in an effort to demoralize Santana. The two girls went by the mile mark in the low 5:40s, and continued to surge. Harper prevailed, and the hard effort by Gregerson left her exhausted and in fifth place. Harper ran a course record 13:56 (for 2.3 miles at Griffen Park) to win. A week earlier, Harper had recorded a 15:34 at the Kit Carson Invite, third fastest girls time on the day (and in an unchallenged race).

"We knew we would have to take some chances to win," El Cap coach Bill Cleves said. "We knew it would take a breakthrough someplace." The Vaqueros were a bit decimated by illness, and were missing a few girls from the back of their pack. It might not have helped against an inspired Santana team. The teams will meet again in the league meet.

Chula Vista's boys and girls teams looked good in a dual with Bonita Vista on Oct. 27. The Chula boys won, 20-40, and the girls triumphed, 25-30. Chula has recently added Marco Huerta and Jesse Jasso to their pack, and team ace Adrian Ramirez is looking good. In fact, he set a course record at Discovery Park.

"We ran well," Bonita coach Ian Cumming said, "and they blew us out of the water."

Aida Garcia paced the Spartan girls.

Coronado's boys and girls teams both finished out their Harbor League seasons at 8-0, SEE PAGE FOUR
