



The fires: too close for comfort

It was early on a Monday evening. I was taking a break from writing stories for Track Magazine, and I was flipping channels, cutting away from boring Charger football to the much-more-compelling Carlsbad firestorm news coverage.

Outside, Santa Ana winds whistled up the canyon in back of our house, blowing steadily in roughly the 40-plus mile per hour range.

My nine-year-old daughter, Hannah, was just being tucked into bed, when she asked, "What is that glowing light outside?"

I quickly went to the window looking out into the canyon and saw flames. They were already thirty feet high, were obviously out of control and were only about 100 yards away. I called to my family, "My God, there's a fire, we have to get out."

So we began a hurried evacuation process. The threat was so immediate that we could do little more than get Hannah dressed and grab our car keys and wallets. She still has nightmares (I've had a couple of bad dreams, too). And, nine days after the fire, one of our cats, Stripes, came limping back home, with singed whiskers and burned paws. He's resting comfortably, paws bandaged, as I write this. When the dreams will go away, I cannot say.

Obviously, that issue of Track Magazine never got to the printer. I think most of our readers, some of whom have had similar or worse experiences, will understand.

This is a slightly expanded issue, including extra pages, and we have contained herein just about all of the material (meets, photos, etc.) that was scheduled for the last issue, plus the normal coverage for this issue.

We apologize for any inconvenience to our regular readers. To our subscribers, I will offer a rebate or will extend subscriptions by one issue if you wish.

If the fire was going to come directly at us, there wasn't much time for anything else. Possessions to be saved were the clothes you wore and maybe what you could carry in one trip to the car. We didn't even have a chance to round up our cats (some were outside).

I took a last look as we hurriedly prepared to leave, and I noticed that the wind was pushing the fire in a narrow path up the canyon and, possibly, <u>past</u> our house.

We then decided to move our cars a block away, have a neighbor watch Hannah and my wife and I came back to see if we could fight the blaze.

With a garden hose, I started dousing flames that were now, in spots, only about 50 to 60 feet from my house. The spot fires were numerous.

Soon, I noticed that a number of neighbors had come to aid in the fight, and they brought extra hoses, shovels and other tools.

The fire continued to burn in a path that was taking it away from my house, but which threatened neighbors. I continued to douse hot spots and fight flames, but would take a quick periodic break to check on my nearest neighbor's progress (they were more directly in the fire's path). Lark, my wife, was my eyes and ears, and I had her continue to check a perimeter around the house to make sure that some sparks hadn't been overlooked. My nearest neighbor had the fire basically skip over his house, although there was some smoke and other damage. Another neighbor wasn't so fortunate. His family had just enough time to get away with the family dog before the fire caused severe damage. Much of the contents of the house were ruined by the flames, smoke and water. Remarkably, the fire was stopped before there was more major damage, thanks in part to the fast work of the local volunteer firefighters (aided later by a number of fire crews), and by the efforts of the neighbors and townspeople who rushed to the scene and worked hard long into the night. My family was extremely fortunate. Our lives were disrupted for a few days, and about a third of our property was reduced to ashes, but there was no damage to our house. Still, there are aftereffects. Hannah, our daughter, has to check which way the wind is blowing every night before she goes to bed.

The fires, of course, were much worse in the Carlsbad/La Costa/San Marcos area. My printer is located almost in the middle of the burned area, and was shut down for a day or two as well.


Two schools, La Costa Canyon and San Marcos, lost their home cross country courses to the blaze. School was closed at a number of institutions. At least one high school runner, Aniko Felsen, a member of the San Marcos varsity girls team, had her home completely destroyed.

To the fire's victims, I offer my sincerest and most heartfelt sympathies, not only for the loss, but for having your lives turned upside down.

To those who helped, from neighbor to friend to volunteer firefighter to professional firefighter, I extend my deepest gratitude.

At our house, we consider ourselves extremely fortunate.





St. Augustine Invite: Holtville, Saints boys impress; Uni girls look good; Ramirez wins great race

The St. Augustine Invitational is annually a preview of the CIF Championships for the smaller schools.

The races, after all, featured virtually all of the major players in Divisions IV and V (with a few larger schools sprinkled in), and were run on the CIF courses.

Based on those results, the St. Augustine boys and University girls should be strong favorites in Division IV, while the Holtville



boys and La Jolla Country Day girls seem to have an advantage on their Division V rivals.


Best race of the day (and maybe of the year to this point) was in the boys varsity, where Madison's Nick Hamlin, St. Augustine's Adam Greene and Holtville's Miguel Ramirez separated themselves from the other contenders early on. Ramirez, in his first race of the year, had to struggle at times to stay with the surging Hamlin and Greene, but kept contact.

In the final straight, the three sprinted abreast for the final 50 meters, with Ramirez edging Hamlin, who just edged Greene. All were credited with 16:13 clockings, quick times on the CIF course.

For purposes of comparison, only three runners at last year's county finals were faster: Larry Henderson, Ayub Abdusalam and Adrian Ramirez. David McQuitty ran 16:14 last year.

The Saints, with Brian Sullivan often as good or better than Greene, and with some depth, are obviously strong favorites in Division IV, ahead of Clairemont and Coronado.

Holtville, in their first local action this year, had some good runners behind Ramirez, including Robert-John Gonzales (17:11) and Luis Salazar (18:14). They were missing last year's number two man, Jose Gallegos. Calvin Christian's young team will be Holtville's main challenger. Uni's girls have no real challenger in Division IV. Coronado has a young team that is probably a year away. La Jolla Country Day has put together a decent squad behind soph Lindsay Weinberg, and is a bit ahead of Francis Parker in Division V. It was the race of the year: Holtville's Miguel Ramirez, St. Augustine's Adam Greene, and Madison's Nick Hamlin all ran 16:13 in a near dead-heat.



Other meets: Hunt'ton Beach: Santana girls win; SLO: TP girls second


Santana's girls won the Division II Girls championship at last month's Central Park Invitational at Huntington Beach.

Santana's 65 points bettered Cheyenne (Wyoming), Marina, Thousand Oaks and local outfits from La Jolla, Ramona and Grossmont.





Southern Cal: Yucaipa teams dominate; RB, Fallbrook, OG top local teams

Yucaipa's teams dominated the Southern California Invitational, with both the boys and girls taking first in team times.

The Yucaipa girls, ranked in one poll as the number three team in the nation, and in another poll as the top state team in Division II, looked the part. But girls teams from both Fallbrook and Orange Glen (also among the state's best), were competitive, despite some setbacks. The Fallbrook girls, for instance, dropped completely out of the team competition when one runner, Mindy Green, turned an ankle and had to drop out. In the unique scoring system of this meet, a dnf (did not finish) is fatal. The Southern Cal meet has separate races for each of the seven varsity running positions, with number one runners racing against number one runners, number twos vs. number twos, and so on. The times of all seven are added together at the end of the day, to determine the championship. If the meet had been scored as a typical invite, with the top five from each school added together, Fallbrook would have taken second to Yucaipa. (Top teams would have been Yucaipa 52, Fallbrook 82, Orange Glen 88, Rancho Bernardo 134, Escondido 188.) Another time comparison is even more revealing. Yucaipa's top seven girls averaged 15:39 on the Guajome Park course. Fallbrook's six varsity finishers (not counting Green) averaged 15:43.5.



Impressive for the Broncos was freshman Sean Ricketts, who won the number threes race in 16:48, the tenth fastest time overall. Carlsbad's Reed Steele outraced El Cap's Steve Daynes to win in 16:15 in the number ones race, the fastest of the day. The girls number ones race went to Yucaipa's Kimi Welch, who ran 14:27 to best Fallbrook's Tricia Mattson (14:42) and OG's Kendra Goffredo (14:52). 
As the season winds down, there is still some drama to be had in the final week of dual meets. A number of crucial duals were scheduled late this week, too late for this publication's press deadline.


