TITAN TRACKFEST ACTION: Poway's Josh Pope used a sizzling kick to win the boys 1500 in 4:06 last week. Sweetwater's Allen Thompson anchored the Devils to a 43.37 in the 4x100 relay, fastest of the meet.

ARCADIA NEWSMAKERS: Morse's Monique Henderson beat a star-studded field in the Invitational 400, running 53.74. Rancho Bernardo's Allison Hall ran a key 1200 leg for the Bronco distance medley team, which ran a good 10:34 and finished sixth.

Catching up with...

Rancho Buena Vista

Jason Gatewood popped a personal best of 6-9 in the high jump in a dual meet with Mt. Carmel on Tuesday.

He went on to attempt 6-11, and barely missed it, knocking it off with his calves.

"He's not afraid to jump at seven feet," RBV coach Tom Lux said.

The all-around senior talent also ran the 110 high hurdles in 15.4, the 300 intermediates in 41.7 and long jumped 20-3. He is also a 12-6 vaulter, but RBV has a pair of 14-foot jumpers, so he's not needed there.

The 6-9 jump moves Gatewood into a tie for 15th on the alltime list in San Diego County history.

Three have gone 7-feet or better, including Escondido's Eric Hollins last year.

Five are tied at 6-10, and six more athletes range between 6-9 and 6-10. Gatewood is currently tied with Dean Owens, El Cajon (1970) and Johnny Green, Lincoln (1979).

Scripps Ranch

Bernard Grady tossed 59-2 for second at Arcadia, moving up his PR from 57-4. He reportedly had several throws in the 61-foot range in warmups at Arcadia, "without stepping out of the ring," according to Scripps coach Bob Oliver.

Patrick Henry

Henry coach Thom Hunt may have something in Delinda Tomagni. She ran the 300 hurdles in 48.80 in the "slow" race at last week's Titan Trackfest in what was her first hurdle race ever.

Tomagni, a sprinter, was converted to the hurdles this year, but has had few opportunities in the early season.

St. Augustine:

Saints coach Jerry Downey may have uncovered a nugget in junior distance runner Ryan Moorcroft.

Moorcroft, a 6-4 football player, was discovered by Downey when he won the school's annual Turkey Trot in the fall. He turned out for track after basketball season was over, and has shown some flashes of talent.

His first race, after just a few weeks of training, was a 2:03 for 800. Last week, he ran 4:11.69 for 1500 at the Titan Trackfest, which is equivalent to 4:30 for 1600.

University of San Diego:

Distance runner Michelle
Barrack, who was having a great
comeback season, is recovering
from an ankle injury. Barrack
turned her ankle when she stepped
on a sprinkler while working out.

It was originally expected that she could be back by mid-April, but she is so far unable to resume running, although she is doing cross training.

Morse

Starla Henderson's hamstring is not yet at full strength. The first signs of injury came at the Bronco Invitational, held in damp and often chilly conditions. She's been held out of action until the Arcadia meet, where she ran the third leg as the Tigers ran 47.54.

"Starla's hamstring acted up,"
Morse girls coach Gary MacDonald said, and the Tigers scratched
the 4x400 relay.

San Pasqual

The Golden Eagles girls' team has taken some major hits.

Sprinter Michelle Kennedy and jumper Adrianne Marshall, both of whom ranked as among the best in the county, have left the team.
All-around talent Maggie Blunt is probably lost for the year with a knee injury. Blunt was a top hurdler, but also filled in well on throws, jumps and relays

West Hills

Ben Aragon will probably have a few serious tries at the 1600 after his impressive 1200 leg at Arcadia, where he ran 3:08.2. He ran 1:58 for 800 meters last year, as a soph, and will probably stick with that event in the finals this year, but coach John Liberatore admitted that he was intrigued by Aragon's potential at the 1600.

El Capitan

Nobody is deeper in throwers than the Vaqueros, who have always had a rich tradition in the weights.

Danny Ames, with bests of 64-8 and 192-0 is certainly the most high profile of the athletes, but there is much more.

Senior Wayne Hassey, a first year thrower, has already pushed the shot out to 54-0.25.

John Stokes, known to teammates as "Spanky," reached 48-10 at the Titan meet last week, which was the second best mark in that meet.

Junior Travis Asch has put 46-5.75, and has also thrown the disc 158-6.

Mike Proctor is at 46-0, but is only the team's fifth man.

Junior Chris Blevins, a 143-8 disc thrower from last year, was injured early and has yet to see action.

On the girls side, El Cap has senior Kendra Rhea, who ranks number two in the county in the shot (39-11) and number one in the disc (132-3). She's backed up by Beth Goins (35-0 and 104-8) and Cassie Keller (105-3).

of coaching all this talent is Dave Hillberg, a former thrower at the school. He's been the throws coach in recent years, but is now also the head boys coach.

Torrey Pines

Camille Dredge was suffering from a bad chest cold at Arcadia, which had to contribute to a subpar race. She was originally scheduled to return to run 800 in the distance medley, but Torrey coach Brent Thorne replaced her with frosh Krista Romley.

Rancho Bernardo

Don't have a heart attack if you see two of this team's top sprinters, Adrienne Farrington and Amy Taylor, show up in hurdle results soon.

Farrington has been working at the 100 hurdles, but has been suffering from shin splints recently, so her debut could be delayed.

Taylor is still a novice, but has obvious potential in the 300s. In a recent workout, she ran the distance in 51-seconds in consecutive training runs.

ALL-TIME TRACK: Three top '60s track runners are gone, including a legend

Vernus Nimrod Ragsdale, Jr. 1942-1999 Lincoln High, 1962 100 and 220 yards

They called him Rags.

Those who saw him run in high school (including this writer) are convinced that he was as fast as any prep runner ever to come from this area. Yes, that includes Elijah Jefferson, Riley Washington, Vince Williams and Ike Okenwa.

To understand, you have to start with what was different about high school track in the early 1960s.

Distances were run in yards. Times were kept by hand-timers (those in big meets were excellent timers). The tracks were dirt. The 220 yards was run on the straight whenever possible. And, for a few years, the state meet prelims and finals were held in the afternoon and evening of the same day.

The talent level in the sprints at the state meet in 1962 was, simply, great. Forrest Beaty of Glendale Hoover held the national record in the 220 and had tied the 100 yard standard. Future Olympians Tommie Smith (Lemoore) and Richard Stebbins (Los Angeles Fremont) were in the loaded fields. And Rags held his own.

In the baking heat of Modesto, Ragsdale ran six quality races in one day.

At 2 p.m., he ran 9.6 in the 100 prelims, barely qualifying for the final. His heat included future Olympic gold medalist Smith, future Olympic 200 runner Stebbins, Ed Moody of Oakland McClymonds and San Bernardino's Tom Hester, who held the national mark in the low hurdles.

At 2:40, Rags went a little crazy, winning his heat of the straight 220 yards in 20.4, with the aid of a wind. The next runner was timed in 21.0. Ragsdale became the crowd betting favorite.

At 3:20, Rags anchored his Lincoln teammates to a qualifying position in the 4x220 relay. Rags began fast, but was visibly coasting over the final 120 yards, and the team still clocked 1:27.1.

It hadn't cooled off much by the time the 100 yard final was run, at 7:50 p.m. It was a blanket finish for the field, with Beaty bursting ahead at the last second. Ragsdale, in lane nine, was given third, in 9.6.

Serious betting for the 220 began. Many favored Beaty, the defending state champ and national record holder. Some liked Stebbins. But Ragsdale now had many backers.

One argument went something like this.

Fan number one: "I'm taking Ragsdale."

Fan number two: "Ahead of Beaty?"

Fan one: "Man, he just ran 20.4!"

Fan two, pooh-poohing: "That was with the wind."

Fan one, emphatic: "I don't care WHAT it was with!"

The 220 went off at 9:05. Rags and Stebbins were out on Beaty. At the race's midpoint, Beaty slowed with a pull and dropped out. Stebbins and Rags battled it out, with the Fremont flyer edging Ragsdale by a tenth.

(The two later became teammates at Grambling College, where they combined with two other California hotshots on world record sprint relay teams.)

Ragsdale ended his long day of competition at 10:05, anchoring the Hornets to 1:27.8 in the relay, good for fourth. The strain of six races showed.

Ragsdale's efforts, plus an upset win by teammate James Kennedy in the long jump, gave Lincoln a share of the state title. That only lasted days, however, as a film review of the super-close 100 yards later showed that Ragsdale was actually fifth.

Among his other exploits, Ragsdale had a best of 20.3 (windy), run at the 1962 CIF Finals, held at Kearny High. At the same meet, he ran a 9.4w to win the 100, beating Grossmont's Steve Adams, who had run a 9.4w the week before in the prelims.

Rags had run a 9.5 at the JC Relays at Sweetwater in midseason. Although no wind gauge was present, qualified observers accepted the mark as legitimate.

Considering the dirt surfaces, Ragsdale was flying. He gained further legitimacy with his second in the state 220 against great rivals, and with his college exploits at Grambling.

He ran such a monster 220 leg (in the low 19s) on one 880 relay team that he was named the outstanding track athlete at the 1964 Mt. SAC Invitational.

Ragsdale was born on December 16, 1942 in Chandler, Oklahoma, but grew up in San Diego.

He was one of the county's best sprinters throughout his career at Lincoln High, and was given a track scholarship to Grambling. He dropped out after his junior year to try Canadian pro football. A knee injury ended his football career, and Ragsdale served in the Army from 1967 to 1970. He eventually moved to the San Francisco, where he worked for an electronics firm owned by an uncle. He died of a heart attack on January 26 at San Francisco General Hospital. He was 56.

He is survived by a daughter, Vernetta Ragsdale, and a son, Vernus III, both of Vallejo.

San Diego Union sports columnist Nick Canepa devoted most of his column to retelling the Ragsdale legend in a February issue.

The legends do abound. One popular story had Ragsdale taking the baton in the 880 relay at the JC Relays and catching a good San Diego runner (Eddie Logans) from behind. Logans' father, watching from the stands, had a heart attack. So the legend goes. Ragsdale had that kind of effect on track fans.

David Matheny 1949-1999 Monte Vista High, 1967

Two miles

Dave Matheny was a key member of the great Monte Vista distance teams coached by Bob Larsen in the late 1960s. In fact, the 1966 Monarch boys were profiled last fall by Track Magazine as one of the most dominant local cross countryteams ever.

That success carried over to the track, where Matheny was fourth in the CIF two-mile in 1967, running 9:23.5. Teammates Don Olsen and Dave Carter were second and third in that race, which was won by Lincoln's Otis Martin, in 9:01.0.

Matheny and his brothers, also Monte Vista runners, were credited with starting a trend of competing in their bare feet. The family lived in rural Jamul, teammate Don Olsen remembered, and had developed tough feet. The barefoot look became a Monte Vista trademark for a few years.

Matheny was born January 12, 1949. He was living in Florida and was self-employed when he died on February 12.

Chuck Marshall 1949-1999 Crawford High, 1967

880 yards Marshall was a big meet runner in the middle distances.

He set a Crawford school record for 880 yards when he ran 1:55.8 for fourth in the 1967 CIF race. which was won by Matheny's teammate, Dan Ungricht, in 1:53.0.

CIF success was nothing unusual for Marshall. He won the Class C CIF title at 660 yards in 1965, and won the Class B CIF title at 660 yards in 1966.

Marshall was a San Diego Battalion Fire Chief when he died of an apparent heart attack on April 8. He was 49.

He was born April 26, 1949 in San Diego. After graduation from Crawford, he attended San Diego City College and San Diego State University.

Marshall is survived by his wife, Marilu, five children and six* grandchildren.

Arcadia:

Monique, Donoghue, 'Pack are ready for prime time

McInvale runs fastest state 3200; Morse, UC relays look good; Escudero sizzles in afternoon action

Monique Henderson, Kathleen Donoghue and the West Hills boys distance medley relay team were all winners in Invitational events at last week's presitigious Arcadia Invitational.

It was a day of mixed results for San Diego's best at this year's edition of the meet, which has become THE mid-season meet in the west.

Morse's Henderson showed her class by beating a top field in the Invitational 400 meters, making a sensational, and decisive, move on the last turn to win the race in 53.74. That is the fastest prep time in the nation.

For Henderson, it was nothing new. She also won last year as a frosh, in 52.93, which turned out to be her fastest time of the year. Last year's Arcadia meet was held a bit later in the year (April 25), after a storm caused a postponement.


Rancho Bernardo's Kathleen Donoghue, down to her third attempt, set a meet record at 12feet in winning the Invitational girls vault. She was the only jumper to clear the height, as three other competitors stopped at 11-6.

Donoghue went on to try 12-7, and had a couple of good jumps. Bronco teammate Natalie Dennison, who has a 12-0 best, had a disappointing night. She didn't clear her opening height of 10-6 after looking great in warmups.

The West Hills boys won the distance medley in 10:24.40, the fastest prep outdoor time in the U.S. to date.

You could tell they would be in contention as soon as leadoff runner Ben Aragon rounded the first turn. He ran even with a Don Lugo athlete and was clocked in 3:08.2, a quality time for 1200.

Kyle Conerly (50.4) kept the Pack even, and Matt Rendina (2:05.6) lost some ground but kept the team

within striking distance of the leaders.

Evan Fox blasted a quick first lap, settled in, and kept measuring the leader until the final straight when he surged ahead. His 4:19.9 effort reflected the uneven pacing.

Other highlights:

Ramona's Matt McInvale ran the fastest time of the year by a California runner (9:11.55), in taking ninth in a field loaded with out of state talent. Granite Hills' Jason Finch was 12th in 9:14.03, also an excellent mid-season time. McInvale uncharacteristically stayed off the pace early, and had plenty left at the end, indicating that there was still gas in the tank.

Grady threw a PR 59-2 in the shot to take second in the Invitational event. La Jolla's Wade Green hit a PR in the daytime shot, winning at 57-9.5. El Capitan's Danny Ames was seventh in the Invite shot, throwing 58-0.5. Earlier, Ames had a disappointing result in the Invite discus, not getting out of the prelims after fouling his first two throws and spinning just 162-9 on his third.

University City and Morse both produced some very quick sprint relay times.

The Morse girls 4x100 team

were fourth in 47.54, despite a slightly slow last handoff. Long Beach Wilson's girls won the race in 46.47, but the Tigers were right on the pace until the last exchange. Starla Henderson, who has been nursing a tender hamstring, felt it again in this race, and the Tigers cancelled a try at the 4x400.

The Invite boys 4x100 featured a Long Beach Poly squad that might turn out to be the fastest high school team ever. They blitzed the field with a 40.45, which means they could dip under 40-seconds by year's end and threaten the high school record.

University City's boys team was third in the race, running 41.89, and Morse's boys were fourth, at 42.11. Those times put both teams in contention for medals at the state meet.

The Morse boys 4x400 relay team returned later to run a 3:25.63 in the seeded race, and that leads the county.

Helix's Courtney Baird ran 10:43.52, the fastest local time this year, in the Invite 3200. She faded to ninth after running with the leaders for the first 1600, which she covered in 5:12. Her time was the fastest by a local athlete since Milenca Glusac was running for Fallbrook in 1991. She returned

later in the meet to anchor her distance medley team with a 5:09 1600.

El Capitan's Maggie

Escudero ran to the year's fastest clockings in both hurdle events in daytime action. She turned the 300 hurdles in 46.55, which puts her almost two seconds ahead of her local rivals. She also ran to a 15.48 for the 100 hurdles. Both times are PRs.

Rancho Bernardo's girls and San Pasqual's boys both ran quality distance medleys.

The Broncos were sixth in the Invite girls DM, and were the fastest local team, running 12:34.17. The lineup was Allison Hall (3:48.5), Amy Taylor (59.2), Kaleena Yee (2:29.9) and Julie Manson (5:16.2). Hall's leadoff leg was a key factor and came after a 5:18 1600 in daytime action. Taylor's sub-60 for the 400 was her third of the day (including two relay splits and an open race).

The Golden Eagle boys ran 10:34.95 for seventh in the primetime DM (21 teams finished the race). Their lineup included Luis Mariscal (3:16.4), David Clagett (51.9), Matt Johnson (2:04.3), and Adam Van Wart (4:22.3, after a blazing 59-second first lap).

Rancho Buena Vista's Jason Gatewood finished in a tie for seventh in the Invite high jump, making 6-6. The meet was won at 6-8, which was cleared by three athletes.

Vista's Sean Daley got his first taste of big-time vault competition and hung in well, clearing 14-6 for tenth. He had two close misses at 15-0, which is his PR. The winner topped out at 16-0 and the top California vaulter in the field cleared 15-6.

Helix's Terron Franklin won a daytime 200 meters in 21.90, putting him in the county lead in that event. Escondido's R. J. Oliver won another daytime 200 in 22.23. In prime time, UC's Steve Hayes ran 21.99 for sixth in the seeded race.

Other qualify efforts:

Morse's jay Hackett ran 49.35 in the seeded nighttime 400 meters.

Rancho Bernardo's Sean Ricketts ran 1:56.24 in the Invite 800, which leads the county. Fallbrook's Bill Ungricht ran 1:56.65 in a daytime race.

Serra's Marcus Chandler caught Vista's Justin Neuroth to take 10th in the Invite 1600. Chandler ran 4:20.24, and Neuroth ran 4:21.05.

El Capitan's Kendra Rhea threw the shot 38-1.75 (for 13th in the Invite) and the disc 129-10 (for 12th in the Invite).





The combination of good weather and a fast oval led to a truckload of fast times, even though many of the area's best athletes were off testing the waters at Arcadia.

Among the highlights:

Monte Vista's Justin Hunt ran to a 15.07 win in one race of the 110 high hurdles, which was the fastest in the section this year.

Sweetwater's Joe Gutierrez, in a second heat, zipped to a 15.10. Four other hurdlers were pressing the winners, including Mira Mesa's Ben Church and Jarred Stites and San Pasqual's David Clagett in the first race, and Rancho Bernardo's Bobby Salimi in the second.

Sweetwater's 4x100 team cranked out a 43.37 in the 400 relay, and three other teams dipped below 44-seconds.

Rancho Buena Vista's 4x400 relay team clocked a 3:27.06, making them the first area team to dip below 3:30 (Morse's team surpassed the mark, hours later, at Arcadia).

Host Poway dominated many of the distance runs, especially on the boys side. Devin Lyons-Quirk won Friday's 3000 in 8:57 (equals a 9:40 two-mile); and Josh Pope unveiled a great kick to take Saturday's 1500 in 4:06 (equals a 4:26 mile).

The Titans also had the fastest times in the boys 4x800, the boys 4x1600, the boys distance medley and the girls distance medley.



Watch for: With Petersen in place, this team would match up with many, many large schools for the top five or six athletes, which makes this an extremely powerful program at the league level.
