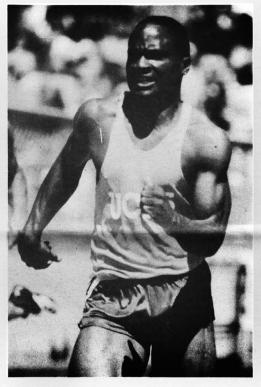

The Season:

It's starting to get interesting...

The 2000 track season is hot, and getting hotter.

Perhaps spurred by a long spell of great weather, the local preps are putting up great marks every week.

Last weekend saw outstanding efforts by the locals at the Arcadia Invitational, and at the Titan Trackfest.

The local boys distance crew is out to rule the world, or at least the state, juding by the Arcadia results.

San Diego Section runners went 1-2 in the Invitational 800 meters. and had the fastest three California times in the 3200 meters. In addition, Monte Vista's Jon Rankin was a competitive second in the 1600 in excellent time.

On top of all that, the West Hills boys distance medley relay team set a new meet record, bettered the all-time section best (see page two for more on that), and ran the fastest outdoor time in the country.

There were other significant efforts at Arcadia by RB's Bobby Salimi in the high hurdles, by Grossmont's Jonathan Takahashi in the vault, and by RB's Julie Manson in the girls 3200.

Closer to home, Mt. Carmel's Travis Offner and Poway's Audrey Pound starred at the Titan meet with great marks.

The boys have been just spectacular. At mid-April, there are season bests of 1:53.2, 6-10, 183-2, 4:10, 9:10, 14.28, and two vaulters at 15-6.

One downside to this point has been numerous injuries to many of the section's best boy sprinters and hurdlers. For more, read on.

Distance Medley History:

Pack's run recalls El Cajon's 1972 team

hen the West Hills boys

distance medley relay team ran 10:04.12 at last week's Arcadia Invitational, they didn't just put up the fastest time in the nation this year, and the fastest in the history of the Arcadia Invitational.

They also ran the fastest time ever recorded in the event by a San Diego-area team, which blew some of the dust off of the local history of the event.

The old record belonged to a foursome from El Caion High. which was anchored by one of the true legends in local prep distance running.

Those Braves ran 10:10.2 in the 1972 San Diego Relays, held at Balboa Stadium.

High school kids ran yard

distances exclusively in those days, and the Braves' time converts to the metric equivalent of 10:06.7, according to Track & Field News prep scholar Jack Shepard.

The El Cajon anchor was Terry Cotton, who still ranks, 28 years after the fact, as one of the very fastest local preps.

Cotton's credentials: yards (unconverted) bests of 4:05.5 in the mile, 8:54.7 in the two mile and 1:54.0 in the half mile.

He ran the 4:05.5 in finishing second in the California state finals, to Garden Grove's Mark Schilling (who just edged Cotton, running 4:05.4).

That still stands as the second fastest ever four laps run by a local prep outdoors, and is actually still the official section record.

Tim Danielson's famous sub-4:00 mile came in post-season open competition; and Thom Hunt's almost as famous 4:02.7 mile came in an indoor meet, also in open competition.

Metric equivalents of Cotton's bests, according to the T&F News Big Red Book, are 4:04.1 for 1600 meters, 8:51.6 for 3200, and 1:53.4 for 800.

In the 1972 SD Relays distance med, Cotton anchored his team in 4:07-plus, after El Cajon and Clairemont (now the number three team on the all-time list), battled for the first three legs.

The El Cajon head coach then was Wayne Layton, now living in retirement in the Long Valley area of Idaho.

'We didn't have really great runners in the quarter and half," he remembered. "That's not a putdown of the kids, because they really ran the best they could."

Layton recalled that pre-meet press attention had centered on the El Cajon vs. Clairemont matchup in the race, with Clairemont, then an incredible distance power, a slight favorite.

At that time, the distance medley was run in the order of 440, 880, 1320 and mile.

El Cajon opened with Don Smith running the 440 yards out of the blocks in "about 51.8 or 52," Layton said.

John Owens ran decently in the 880 leg, with 1:59.8, but El Cajon was trailing Clairemont.

Then El Cajon's Bruce Kuehne (pronounced Kee-ney) "ran way over his head," according to Layton. Kuehne, more of a two miler (he ran 9:17.3 that year), ran his three-lap segment in the 3:07s to put the Braves right back in the

Cotton got the baton, still, "a little bit behind," Layton said, "and it was over in the first lap. He just went for it."

Clairemont, with Rick Lord and

Mark Mallec on the team, was second in the race, in 10:15.9. That's the metric equivalent of 10:12.4.

When Layton heard about the West Hills effort at Arcadia, he was more than congratulatory.

"That's neat," he said. "That's outstanding. It's great that kids still get excited about running that well '

"It's really tough to do," he said about the team effort required to put up such a mark.

He listed the requirements for a distance relay record.

'You have to have the format, you have to get the competition, you have to have the guys to do it, and you can't double or triple your runners," he said.

West Hills followed that exact recipe to better El Cajon's record.

"I'm really proud to see somebody from the Grossmont League do it," Layton said.

Arcadia/ Flo-Jo: Rankin, Neuroth, Manson, Salimi, Thornton, Pack!

Monique Henderson's first ever loss in her high school career was the big story for San Diego Section entrants at the Arcadia Invitational/FloJo Memorial meet last Saturday at Citrus College.

Henderson was outraced by Cerritos Gahr soph Angel Perkins in the invite 400 meters. Perkins was timed in 52.62, just off the meet record of 52.61, and Henderson was just a step back until she came almost to a stop in her final stride. She was on pace to also get under 53 seconds.

It was a fine early-April time for Henderson, even if the final result wasn't what she wanted. Track fans all over the state are already anticipating a rematch at the state meet in June.

"Her (Henderson's) first 100 meters was maybe not as good as it could be," Morse coach Gary MacDonald said later. "But it really wasn't a bad race. Best way to sum it up: great athlete has off day."

San Diego's boy distance runners could almost do no wrong.

RBV's Nick Thornton and Rancho Bernardo's Sean Ricketts went 1-2 ahead of a large 800 field (17 runners). Thornton ran a great tactical race and unleashed a withering kick to run a PR of 1:54.04. Ricketts had to come from way back to salvage second place. Another local, Vista's Jared Emmons, also made a big move late in the race to move from near last to sixth.

In the 1600, Monte Vista's Jon Rankin, running a broken-field race, took second in a fast 4:10.08. Esperanza's Ryan Bousquet ran down Rankin in the final straight, and won in 4:09.37. For Rankin, it was a 7-second improvement of his best time, set just last week.

In the 3200, won by Utah's Josh Rohatinsky in 9:01.94, locals were the first three California runners across the line, all in good times

Vista's Justin Neuroth, now

getting very comfortable in this event, moved ahead of local rivals Matt McInvale and Travis Laird to take fourth in 9:10.36. Runners from Oregon and Arizona were second and third in the race.

Ramona's McInvale was fifth in 9:10.53, by far his best effort of the outdoor season, and San Marcos' Laird was seventh in 9:11.40, a big PR for him.

"He (Neuroth) is really getting a lot of confidence," Vista coach Pete Brooks said later. Before this season, Neuroth had not really given the 3200 a serious effort.

The capper was the performance of the West Hills boys distance medley relay team near the end of the meet.

The Wolfpack dueled Don Lugo for the first three legs, much like last year's Arcadia meet, but at a much faster clip.

West Hills won in 10:04.12, which was a new meet record, and is the fastest outdoor time of the year. It also set a new standard for

local distance medley teams (see page two for details).

Ben Aragon led off for the Pack, running the 1200 in 3:05.2, despite being boxed and shoved through much of his leg. His burning stretch run showed that there was much more left

"I think that could have been a 3:02 without all the interference," West Hills coach John Liberatore said.

Kyle Conerly (50.2) and Kevin Schible (1:59.0) kept West Hills just a stride in front of Don Lugo.

That all changed when Evan Fox got the baton. He burned a 57 first lap, went through 800 meters in 1:59, and continued through 1200 in about 3:03.

He faded in the final lap, due to his fast early pace and a lack of competition, but West Hills still won by more than 10 seconds.

The Wolfpack bettered the old section best of 10:10.2 (unconverted yard time) of the 1972 El Cajon High team. RB's Julie Manson got in some fast running of her own, running a quick 10:36.83 for fourth in the 3200. Glendale Hoover's Anita Siraki showed her class by winning in 10:18.

Manson was uncertain of her condition just before the race. She had a slight leg strain (from highjumping, of all things), but warmed up well at race time.

"She is just a machine with her even splits," RB distance coach Terry Dockery said. Manson stuck to her race plan and steadily moved up on the field. Her first 1600 was 5:16.

Teammate Bobby Salimi had a breakthrough performance in the high hurdles, running 14.28 despite clobbering the last two hurdles. He was leading the race at the eighth hurdle and was on his way to a sub-14.20, which is what the winner ran.

The 14.28 now ranks Salimi as the fourth fastest hurdler in section history. He later doubled back in the 300s, taking fifth in the invite section, in 38.89, a seasonal best.

Throughout the meet, the good marks by locals just kept piling up, as did noteworthy, nation-leading performances by the always stellar Arcadia fields.

Grossmont's Jonathan
Takahashi had monster clearances at lower heights on his way to making 15-6 in the vault, which is his PR.
That jump ties Takahashi for the section lead with Mt. Carmel's
Travis Offner, who cleared the same height at the Titan Trackfest earlier in the day.

University City's Lamont Long ran a wind-legal 10.63 for fourth in the invite 100 meters. He ran 10.60 at Balboa one week earlier, but there was no wind gauge at that meet. Earlier, he anchored the UC 4x100 team to a 41.94 third-place finish. UC was missing Steve Hayes, and still was sub-42.

Jesse Bowman led off for UC, with Rayshawn Madden filling in for Hayes, followed by Chauncee Smith and Long.

Mira Mesa's Travis Jones looked good in the discus, ending up at 183-2, good for fourth place. He had at least one other throw past 180 feet.

San Dieguito Academy's Jenna Timinsky led for a quick first lap of the invite 800 meters, and held on to take sixth, in a PR and section leading 2:13.42.

There were mixed results in the girls invite 1600, where Hilltop's Desiree Davila was fifth in 4:59.41, a best for her. Torrey Pines' Julie Komosinski was disappointed with her 5:07 for 11th place. Both girls doubled back to anchor their teams in the distance medley later in the meet.

Other good distance marks were recorded by UC's Katherine Ziegler (5:12.13), San Marcos' Nicole Mier (5:11.99 in the day meet), and Torrey's Angela Petersen (10:59.57 in the invite).

Hoover's Candace Hill reached a season best of 43-7.25 for sixth in the invite shot. Despite a recent PR of 149-plus in the discus, she did not enter that event.

RB's Catie Coin had a nice hurdle double in the afternoon meet, running a section-leading 15.22 in the highs and a season best of 45.40 in the 300s

Mar Vista's Blake Swier won an afternoon 1600 in his PR of 4:25.06.

There were some mixed results for some of the area's best local

sprinters. Patrick Henry's Mike Roberts was third in the afternoon 100 meters in a windy 10.85, but Crawford's Larry Miles pulled up in the race. Escondido's R. J. Oliver was scheduled to run, but didn't.

What's on the immediate horizon for some of the Arcadia standouts?

The West Hills distance crew will run the Mt. SAC 4x800 relay this weekend, while Neuroth and his Vista teammates will load up in the distance medley there.

At Mt. Carmel, Fox will try for his school's record in the 3200. while Aragon will finally get a shot at a quality 1600.

Offner and Takahashi are scheduled to go head to head in the vault in a number of meets.

Henderson will run the 100 and 200 at Mt. SAC.

What about Track & Field Shoes?

Why do we need track spikes? Track spikes provide superior traction on all track surfaces. An athlete who is not using a track spike will slip on every step losing forward thrust . All track athletes from sprints through distances can improve running speed by using spiked shoes.

Will track spikes protect or support my feet?

Absolutely not. In fact, the use of track spikes will increase the load on your feet and lower leg. Spikes have one purpose only speed. They are for improving performance on the track and should not be expected to provide any type of protection.

Should I fit my track shoes like my training shoes?

While we encourage athletes to leave plenty of room at the toe of their trainers, track shoes must fit fairly close in order to work properly. The big toe must come over the lead spike so that you can push off on it. Sprinters need a closer fit than distance runners do.



Which type of shoe is best for my event?

Track spikes are divided into two basic types. All purpose spikes (which have a heel wedge) and sprint spikes (which have no heel wedge). The sprint spikes are useful only to athletes who do not touch their heel to the ground during their event. This is usually distances of 800 meters or less. The all purpose spikes are for all events from sprints through distances, jumps, hurdles, and pole vault.

The spikes are further divided into those with flexible spike plates and those with rigid spike plates. The flexible plate is preferred by distance runners and beginning track athletes because they require less energy to run in. The rigid spike plate is preferred by sprinters and jumpers because it offers a good lever for increased thrust on every step.

What size spikes will I need for my track shoes?

Spike size varies with the track surface that you'll be competing on. In San Diego county most of the tracks are decomposed granite. 3/8 inch spikes are needed for these tracks. In addition, you will go through several sets of these spikes per season as they tend to wear down on this abrasive surface. Most track shoes come with 3/16 inch spikes which are useful on most synthetic tracks and virtually all runways and high jump areas. Special "Christmas tree" spikes are required for athletes competing on the Mondo track at Balboa Stadium. Never use spikes that are too long for the surface you are on because they will tear the spike ports out of your shoes.

How do I install the spikes?

Care must be taken to install the spikes so that they do not become jammed in the spike ports. Start by turning them in by hand and finish by gently snugging them up with the spike wrench. Do not force them if they don't turn smoothly. Back them out and start over again. Never use the shoes with the spike ports empty and change your spikes before they become too worn down.

What to look for:

What to look for:

True story: This writer sent a list of the best marks of the year (all events) to Arcadia meet director Doug Speck, in late March.

Speck e-mailed back that there had to be a mistake. The boys 800 meter marks, he said, were last year's end of the season list.

The local list has indeed looked like a June list for this normally slow-starting event, where anything much below 1:57 usually doesn't come until mid-season.

Of course, in most years there isn't this kind of talent.

Thornton, Ricketts and Emmons were all finalists in the state meet last year, and they're all back, and banging heads in the Palomar meets.

Thornton seems to be the best tactical runner of the group, with a real knack for being in the right place at the right time in a big race. That, combined with his great kick, make him a real force at the local and state levels (which for all practical purposes, are the same this year).

Ricketts has shown signs all year of getting back to his great soph form, but he still runs into tactical problems in big, fast fields.

Emmons seems to be at full health again after nursing a sore leg in the last weeks.

All of this was on display at last week's Arcadia Invite. Thornton moved into a spot just off the pace, and then unleashed his kick at the perfect moment to take the race. Ricketts, meanwhile, seemed in hopeless position with 200 to go, but also put on a fearsome kick to salvage second place. Emmons, near dead last, passed about ten runners in the last 200 meters, often running in lanes three and four.

Fox, off his impressive 1:53.2 dual meet time, would obviously be able to mix it up with anybody, but may concentrate on the 1600 at season's end.

Aragon and Cueva are not that far back of the top group, and Powell is also in the picture. There is speculation that Aragon could move into the 1600, but he would

be a tough contender if he stays in this event.

A darkhorse might be somebody like San Pasqual's Johnson, who ran a 1:55.0 relay split last week, with no competition. Don't overlook this guy.

The only real certainty about this year's CIF finals is that several excellent runners will not make it to the state meet. There is just too much talent. If the early pace is fast, this year's CIF race has a chance to be the greatest local 800 ever, both in quality and quantity.

The best finals to date was in 1966, when the top six finished in 1:51.0, 1:53.1, 1:53.6, 1:54.1, 1:54.1 and 1:54.3 (all times converted from yards). The winner of that race, Hilltop's Terry Rogers, went on to win the state meet a week later.

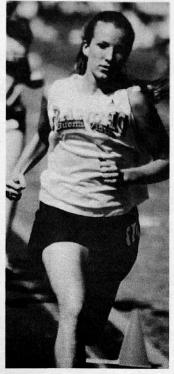

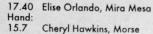

Best bets to break into that group, if anyone can, are Monte Vista's Clark and Camp and some of the young developing hurdlers, such as Morse's Cheryl Hawkins, San Pasqual's Morgan Albini and Escondido's Meggi Afenir.

Hawkins, who has a 15.7 in a dual meet, and Afenir are freshmen. Albini, who has a 16.2 in a dual meet, is a talented sophomore who is new to track.

Some of the others on the list, such as Pound, Avery and Barmer, are better in the 300s at this point, but they also could develop here.

What to look for:

Round up the usual suspects. Most of the traditional relay powers will be in the mix at the end of the year

As with the 100, injuries to some of the area's best sprinters threaten to undermine what should be a strong event.

University City, for instance, was hoping to dip under 41seconds and maybe threaten their own section record. If Steve Hayes is not completely healthy (or maybe is held out of this event) it will be more difficult. But UC has a lot of depth, and they fielded a sub-42 team at Arcadia without

Hayes. Helix is another team with a lot of depth and speed. They ran in the mid-42s at Titan, but were DQd for passing out of the zone.

Rancho Bernardo always seems to get the most out of their talent, and they seem to have plenty of speed this year, so they could make waves.

Morse doesn't have the guns they've had in some years, but nobody is counting them out.

Eastlake is relatively new to this level, but their talent is legit. They are the fastest to date of three strong Metro squads that include Sweetwater and Bonita Vista.

There is also strength in the Harbor, with Lincoln and Hoover, and in the Grossmont with El Cajon Valley, Granite Hills, West Hills, Monte Vista and Mount Miguel.

The Eastern League is the deepest reservoir of sprint talent. After UC and Morse, there are

The relay talent on the girls side is spread out more evenly around

The traditional Eastern powers such as Morse, Serra, San Diego, Mira Mesa, Point Loma and Patrick Henry will be heard from. Morse has a very young crew this season, and they've had problems getting the baton around from time to time. With Monique Henderson anchoring, they put up the season's fastest time (48.66) at Balboa. If she moves out of the event, the Tigers come back to the pack.

Rancho Bernardo ran well at Arcadia, and seems to have the best depth of sprinters.

El Camino ran a 49.97 at Titan with one very slow handoff, and Eastlake ran 50.24 there, also with a slow exchange.

Mount Miguel has Kameelah Allen and other good talent on their team, and they had the fastest time of the day at Titan.

Other teams that have the talent to be right at the front of the pack include Fallbrook, Lincoln, Monte Vista and Rancho Buena Vista, all fueled by some strong sprinters. Teams such as Poway, Carlsbad, San Pasqual and Mt. Carmel also should be in the mix.

A number of teams have yet to put their best lineups together, and there will undoubtedly be some big moves up the ladder.

With a field this wide open, it's way too early to pick favorites.

Health is a big issue in this event, which can exact a toll on young athletes.

Patrick Henry's Jordan Adams, who was a state meet finalist last year, and who jumped past 23-feet (wind-aided), was banged up in an auto accident early in the year, and has yet to jump to his best form.

Another top talent, Rancho Bernardo's Rashard Holmes, had knee surgery in early season, and will be out for the year, although

And Granite Hills' Jeff Hunter, a solid 22-footer, is recovering from a muscle tear in his leg. He's expected back in the hurdles, but may not long jump again this season.

Most consistent jumpers this season have been UC's Jon Reynolds, who was at Serra last year, and Helix's Tony Ortiz, who also high jumps and triple jumps.

It seems only a matter of time before Sweetwater's talented Trandon Harvey pops a 22-plus jump. This is only his fourth- or fifth-best event, however.

Another junior with great talent is Lincoln's Alton Gilbert.

Best jump team is at Patrick Henry, with sprinter Mike Roberts in the mid-22s, and all-around talent Chris Staton just below 22feet. If Adams comes all the way back, that would be one of the best threesomes ever in local history.

It was no fluke, either, as she had a number of other long jumps in that meet. Both head coaches (Terry Scaife and Marty Hauck) agreed that the jump was wind legal.

It confirmed the potential that was briefly glimpsed last year, when Thomas flew 18-5.5 (windy) in the Frosh/Soph championships.

Across the board, the talent level is not at the high water mark that the county enjoyed the past several years, when some great athletes couldn't get out of the section finals.

There is solid talent, however. Thomas, at her best, is a factor at the state level, and some others could develop into 18-footers.

RBV's Hall is an explosive athlete who PR'd last week at 17-7.25. Teammate Aroline Neal, however, will probably stick to running events after she restrained a quad muscle last week.

Of the other 17-footers, Ropes, Gray and Louviere all recorded their best jumps in meets this

Horizon's Devonne Hanke is a talent, but is seldom seen in big meets during the season, so it's
