# League Finals Week is at hand

Hey, there's still time for some quick crash workouts, right?

League championship meets are upon us, with thirteen leagues holding final meets throughout next week, beginning Wednesday and continuing through Saturday.

All of the leagues use the championships to determine allleague teams and individual champions (runners of the year).

Most of the leagues also use their finals to help determine its team champion, in combination with dual-meet results. Two leagues, the Harbor League and the Imperial Valley League, crown their team champs based only on dual meet results.

The schedule:

Wednesday, November 8: WESTERN LEAGUE: At Morley Field, with both boys and girls running the 3.0-mile dual meet course.

Finals count for half of the league championship, with duals counting for the other half. Unbeaten team leaders going into the meet are St. Augustine's boys and University City's girls.

Race schedule:

2:30 p.m, junior varsity girls.

3 p.m., varsity girls.

3:30 p.m., varsity boys.

4 p.m., junior varsity boys.

Meet director is St. Augustine coach.Jerry Downey.

#### IMPERIAL VALLEY LEAGUE: At Calexico.

Duals decide the league championship. When the IVL was in the Southern Section, schools used this meet to qualify for the Section prelims. Now, it's to determine allleague teams and invidual champs. At press time, final dual meets were still on tap to decide the boys championship, while the Brawley girls team was unbeaten.

Race schedule:

2 p.m., boys varsity.

2:30 p.m., girls varsity.

3 p.m., boys junior varsity.

#### Thursday, November 9: HARBOR LEAGUE:

At Morley Field, with boys running the Harbor 3.0-mile course, and girls running the Harbor 2.56-mile course.

Duals decide the league championships, which went to Clairemont's boys and Coronado's girls.

At Morley Field, with boys running the Eastern dual 3.0-mile course, and girls running the Eastern dual 2.56-mile course.

Finals count for half of the league championship, with dual meets counting for the other half.

Unbeaten league leaders are Patrick Henry's boys team and Point Loma's girls team.

Race schedule:

(Friday is a school holiday, so the league is running in the morning.) 9 a.m., varsity boys.

9:30 a.m., varsity girls. 10 a.m., junior varsity boys. Meet director is Serra coach Jim Richards.

**METRO LEAGUES (MESA** and SOUTH BAY):

At Rohr Park, in Bonita. Boys will run 3.1-miles; girls will run 2.2 miles, on the same course used for dual meets and the Baron Invitational.

The two newly-split Metro leagues will run in the same races, but results will be scored separately, as in the custom of the Grossmont Leagues.

League finals will count for half of the league titles, with dual meets counting for the other half.

League leaders in the Mesa League are Sweetwater's boys and Bonita Vista's girls.

League leaders in the South Bay League are Mar Vista's boys and Castle Park's girls.

Race schedule:

2 p.m., boys varsity. 2:30 p.m., girls varsity. 3 p.m., boys junior varsity.

3:30 p.m., girls junior varsity. COASTAL/SOUTHERN

LEAGUES:

At Kit Carson Park, in Escondido. Boys and girls will all run 3.1 miles. Course used will be the same as used in dual meets, and in the Kit Carson Invitational (except for this year).

This is another conference that will run two leagues in each race, with results being sorted out after the finish.

League finals will count for half of the league titles, with dual meets counting for the other half.

League team leaders are Calvin Christian's boys in the Coastal League; and the Julian boys and the Mountain Empire girls in the Southern League. Three girls teams in the Coastal League, Calvin Christian, San Dieguito Academy and Bishop's, all have one loss apiece at press time.

Race schedule:

2:30 p.m., junior varsity boys.

3:15 p.m., varsity girls.

4 p.m., varsity boys.

Meet directors are Calvin Christian coach Bill Stout and Julian coach Bill Porter.

Saturday, November 11: **GROSSMONT LEAGUES** (Grossmont South and Grossmont North):

At Harry Griffen Park, in La Mesa. Varsity boys run 3.1 miles, all other races are 2.4 miles.

Both halves of the Grossmont League will be run in the same race, with each league's results determined afterward.

League finals will count for 2/3 of the league title, with dual meets counting for 1/3.



# **Dual Meet** Roundup:

Most races settled; a few showdowns left

As the season enters its final day of dual meets, a handful of the dual meet championships are still undecided.

The most notable titles still being contested are in the Palomar League, where today the Vista and Poway boys teams will meet, and where the unbeaten Torrey Pines and Mt. Carmel girls teams will

NORTH COUNTY CON-**FERENCE** (Palomar, Avocado and Valley Leagues):

At Guajome Park, in Oceanside. Boys will run 3.2 miles; girls will run 2.6 miles; with athletes running on same course used in most duals and in Southern Cal Invitational.

There will be varsity races only, with each varsity team allowed to include up to 12 athletes.

Each of the league championships will count as half of the league titles, with dual meet standings counting for the other

Team leaders at press time are the Fallbrook boys and Carlsbad girls in the Avocado League; and the Valley Center boys in the Valley League. Final dual meets pit unbeaten girls teams Valley Center and San Pasqual in the Valley League; unbeaten Vista boys and once-beaten Poway boys in the Palomar League; and unbeaten girls teams Torrey Pines and Mt. Carmel in the Palomar League.

Race schedule: 9 a.m., Palomar girls. 9:30 a.m., Avocado girls. 10 a.m., Valley girls. 10:30 a.m., Palomar boys. 11 a.m., Avocado boys. 11:30 a.m., Valley boys.

Meet directors are Fallbrook coach Marty Hauck (Avocado League), Vista coach Pete Brooks (Palomar League), and Ramona coach Dave Wilson (Valley League).

Things are all over in the city leagues, where the final meets were held during the week, and in the Mesa and South Bay leagues, where the major contenders have already faced off.

Similarly, both Grossmont leagues will see strong favorites in meets today, such as the West Hills boys and girls teams, and the Helix girls team. The Granite Hills boys are finished with duals.

The Valley and Avocado Leagues still have some interesting matches on their schedules, and there are some final scores to be settled in the Coastal, Southern and Imperial Valley Leagues as well.

Here's an overview of how things stand as the season approaches its end.


Palomar: Big meets today; Mt. Carmel boys nip Poway; Torrey girls edge RB

BOYS: Unbeaten Vista and once-beaten Poway match up today, along with host Rancho Bernardo, at Rancho Bernardo Community Park.

It will be only the second time this season that the teams have matched up head-to-head.

Both teams were at the season opening Vaquero Invitational, where they raced on short courses. Both were also at Dana Hills, where the competition was held in grade-level races, and at Mt. SAC, where they were in different races.

By contrast, last year the two

teams seemed to face off on a regular basis in various meets.

The two teams have reversed roles this season, with Poway having strong front runners, and Vista having a tight pack team.

The Panthers have been strengthened by the emergence of Eric Hernandez, who at times is the team's number two runner. "He's given us a whole new look," Vista coach Pete Brooks said.

Mt. Carmel nipped Poway last week, 26-29, at Lake Poway, where the two teams were very closely matched.

"Our kids handled their course pretty well," Mt. Carmel coach Dennis McClanahan said. "It's one of the toughest home courses."

Poway and Mt. Carmel are built in a similar fashion, with both having top flight leaders, and both teams having significant gaps.

In this race, Mt. Carmel's Abadir Barre won, in 15:58, ahead of Poway's Devin Lyons-Quirk (16:04) and Luke McGinnis (16:11). When MC's Alan Aradanas was fourth in 16:24, the teams were tied.

Titan Aaron Powell (16:48) was fifth, but the Sundevils put Zack Neilson (17:15), Greg Williams (17:16) and Mike Rentz (17:16) across the finish just ahead of Poway's 4-5 runners, Gavin Coleman (17:17) and Chris Ryan

Mt. Carmel's first five spanned 1:18, but they had 0:51 seconds between their number two and number three runner.

Poway's five were 1:15 apart, but their gap from number two (McGinnis) to number four (Coleman) is 1:06, with Powell about halfway between the pair.

Mt. Carmel has been strengthened in recent weeks by the emergence of Williams, who fits right in with Neilson and Rentz

Elsewhere in the league, Rancho Buena Vista has been running well, although wins are hard to come by in this league.

GIRLS: It's a battle of the unbeatens as Torrey Pines hosts Mt. Carmel at San Dieguito Park today, with Rancho Buena Vista joining in the tri-meet.

The other half of the league meets at RB Community Park, where Rancho Bernardo hosts Poway and Vista.

Biggest meet of the last two weeks was Torrey's 26-30 dual win over RB on Oct. 27.

Torrey's Julie Komosinksi ran a course record (13:20 for 2.25 miles) to hold back RB's strongrunning Kaleena Yee; and Falcon Dani Schuster was third ahead of RB's Allison Hall. Torrey clinched the meet with a fifth and sixth from Krista Romley and Brenna Williams, with a stream of RB runners finishing after them. The Broncs were missing number three Leah Romero, who might have been in position to race with Romley and Williams.

Komosinski's strong race was good news for Torrey. It was the best she's looked this season.


Elsewhere, Mt. Carmel's girls looked like they were back to full strength after a few weeks of battling various bugs, as they dispatched a good Poway team, 18-37, at Lake Poway.

"It was a step back (to where they were at full strength),' McClanahan said

Deanna Sick, Janet Mulvey and Ashlee Dere led a 1-2-3 sweep, finishing in a tight grouping, and the Sundevils had seven of the first nine finishers in the race. Poway's Rachel Good and Kristina Maletz were the only Titans that could break into Mt. Carmel's pack.

RBV's girls nipped Vista, 27-30, in another meet, with the Panthers putting together a good pack to almost counter RBV's front runners. The Palomar is so strong that RBV (one win) and Vista (no wins) have struggled in league meets, despite both teams being not far back of the county's best squads.

BOYS: Fallbrook (3-0) has beaten back the challenges of their closest pursuers, and has just one meet left, against an El Camino team that has some good talent.

Last week, the Warriors edged an underrated San Marcos squad, 26-29, as the Knights battled tough with their first four runners.

Fallbrook's Chris Gausepohl won the race, just ahead of San Marcos's Jimmy Retherford, and the Warriors were just good enough after that, taking third and fifth (Alex Casarez and Jimmy Ungricht). San Marcos put four runners in the top seven, with David Ignacio, Isaac Chitica and Austin Bissonette running well.

'They (San Marcos) are a very good team," Fallbrook coach Marty Hauck said. "We did not take them lightly."

Elsewhere, La Costa Canyon bested El Camino, while Carlsbad was idle.

Carlsbad, San Marcos and La

Costa Canyon finish their seasons with a double dual meet. All enter the meet at 1-1

GIRLS: Carlsbad is 2-0 to this point, and they'll finish this week with a double dual against La Costa Canyon (0-2) and San Marcos (0-2). The Lancers, with great depth, will be strong favorites.

Fallbrook (2-1) and El Camino (2-1) will match up in the league's other meet, and the winner of that meet could be in a position to challenge for a share of the league title when the finals are held next week. The winner of the Fallbrook/El Camino dual would also have to finish first in the league championships to end the season in a tie with Carlsbad.

Last week, Fallbrook beat San Marcos, by forfeit, and El Camino nipped La Costa Canyon, 26-29. Carlsbad was idle.

Valley: VC boys lead; unbeaten girls teams to race today

BOYS: Valley Center's excellent boys continued unbeaten in league meets, with a 23-34 win over a good Escondido squad last week. The Jaguars used their great front -running trio of Gus Polito, Cooper Bachman and Ryan Skerl to sweep 1-2-3 against the Cougars, which is an automatic dual win. The Jags' Tony Illig was sixth in the race, behind only the top two Escondido

Elsewhere, San Pasqual beat Oceanside, and Ramona cruised over Orange Glen.

In three-way meets today, Valley Center (3-0) meets San Pasqual (1-2) and Orange Glen (0-3). In the other half of the league, Ramona (2-1), Escondido (2-1) and Oceanside (1-2) will meet. The winner of the Ramona/Escondido dual would then be in a position to challenge Valley Center for a share of the title in the league championship meet next week. In a title meet, a strong-running pack team could give the Jags some trouble.

GIRLS: Valley Center and San Pasqual both bring 3-0 records to today's three-way meet with Orange Glen (1-2).

Last week, VC blasted Escondido, 16-40, allowing the Cougars only one place (Laura Guzman, in second) among the top seven runners. The Jaguars feature a strong number one, Anna Hough, with a relatively obscure group of young runners behind her that has been doing a good job.

Elsewhere, Ramona and San Pasqual had easy wins over Orange Glen and Oceanside, respectively.

San Pasqual is a classic pack team, with four freshmen manning their top four spots. The team has

BOYS: Sweetwater took a 3-0 record into their final meet with winless Montgomery today, and expectations are that the Devils will be 4-0 heading into the league final. Chula Vista solidified their hold on second with a 20-35 win over Bonita Vista last week, with the Spartans taking the 2 through 6 spots after Baron Dustin Whitson won the race. Sweetwater was idle last week. Chula Vista has a bye this week, while Bonita Vista finishes up with a match against Southwest and a non-scoring **Eastlake** 

GIRLS: Bonita Vista surprised a few people when they handled the Chula girls, 25-32, last week. It was also a bit of an upset when BV's Kristen Gonzalez beat Chula's Sophie Marquez to win the race. Bonita won the meet with a strong back of the pack, placing runners in 4-5-7-8-9 to back up Gonzalez' win.

"Our depth is pretty good,"
Bonita coach Ian Cumming said. "I
always thought that we were a
much better team than most people
knew about."

This week, Chula has a bye, and Bonita will race Southwest, so little is expected to change as the teams head into the finals.

#### East: Henry boys nip Cavers; Pointer girls top Serra

BOYS: Patrick Henry may have clinched the league title when they edged San Diego, 27-28, in a dual meet this week. The win gives Henry a 6-0 record in duals, but also puts them in the driver's seat at the league finals. San Diego finished at 4-2 after an unexpected loss to Point Loma (when ace Christian Dominguez was hurt). The extra loss is important because it means that San Diego cannot win a share of the league crown with a win in the league finals, unless Henry finishes third. That's unlikely, because Henry beat the Pointers, 20-37, in a dual last week.

"I knew they would really go after us," Henry coach Thom Hunt said of the Cavers. "They really went out hard, and tried to take it to us. The key was that our guys maintained their composure and kept moving up."

"It was a team effort, and they really came through," Hunt said.

San Diego had dominated the East in recent years, and Henry has not won a championship in many years.

The Pointers finished at 5-1, after a win over Serra this week, and Mira Mesa ended at 3-3 after a win over Morse.

GIRLS: In a battle of unbeaten teams, Point Loma beat Serra, 24-33, this week, to finish at 6-0. Serra's Amy Montgomery won the race, but Pointers Sara Reid, Rachel Bombaci and Allison Harden were 2-3-4, and teammates also finished 7-8-9.

"Our kids packed really well," Point Loma coach Rob Barnett said. His first three finished within eight seconds.

After Montgomery, Serra had Amy Lang and Lauren Lynaugh get fifth and sixth.

Mira Mesa and Patrick Henry both finished at 3-3, with Henry getting wins over San Diego and Kearny, and Mira Mesa winning over Morse this week.

#### West: Saints boys, UC girls finish unbeaten

BOYS: St. Augustine finished at 6-0 with a win over University City this week. For the frosting on the cake, Saint coach Jerry Downey then arrived home to find a fax from the CIF notifying him that Valley Center would be competing in Division III at CIF.

USD finished at 5-1 with wins over Scripps Ranch and Mission



Most coaches were talking about the Valley Center move, which impacts everybody's state meet chances.

With VC moved up to D III, the Saints will dominate the CIF D IV race. On the other hand, Valley Center will be the favorite in Division III, leaving teams like La Jolla, USD and University City fighting for that last state meet spot.

GIRLS: UC looks better every week. They ran their record to 6-0 with a win over Our Lady of Peace this week.

They followed up their big dual win over La Jolla with an impressive performance at the Kit Carson Invitational. In that meet, soph Jessie Ooms and frosh Rebecca Bostwick set the pace for

Then, UC beat Mission Bay by going 1-3-4-5-6-7, fitting around Rose Serna's runner-up finish for the Bucs.

La Jolla beat Scripps Ranch last week, and finished their season at 5-1. They will be among the favorites, along with UC and Valley Center, in the CIF Division III championships.

#### Harbor: Chief boys, 'Nado girls win titles.

BOYS: It's over. In this league, dual meets decide everything. So. when Clairemont beat Coronado, 15-50, on October 19, they locked up the league title.

Coach Sean Stevenson has a strong first five, with Steven Loforti and Thomas Ferguson trading off at the top spot, with good backing by Darren McTaggart, Mark Tervort and Carlos Gutierrez. They've dominated their Harbor opposition, allowing only Christian's John Wai and Crawford's Idrise Osman to break into their scoring pack.

GIRLS: Coronado had little trouble taking the crown, with easy wins over every Harbor team. Their closest race was with Clairemont, and the Islanders won that meet, 22-39. Everything else was even more of a blowout. The Islanders have been paced by Rhett Chase, who is the only Harbor girl to dip under 18-minutes this year on the Morley course.

#### Coastal: Calvin boys in control. girls teams have three tied

BOYS: Calvin Christian is 5-0 heading into the season's final meet, against a quality Army Navy team that is 4-1. ANA is led by the league's best runner, Will Kraemer, while Calvin has a strong pack.

La Jolla Country Day is at 3-1, with a loss to Calvin and a win over Army Navy. Next best teams are Bishop's and Tri City Christian.

GIRLS: Everything in this league happened on one day, seemingly.

In one three-way meet among the league's best teams, each of the three teams both won and lost a meet

San Dieguito Academy, with Jenna Timinsky and two quick frosh runners, went 1-2-3 against Calvin Christian for an automatic dual meet win.

However, Calvin, a wellbalanced squad, beat Bishop's, 26-29, in the same meet.

At the same time, Bishop's, with a strong ace of their own in Kaili Shumilak, was able to break up San Dieguito's top group, and the teams tied, 28-28, with the Knights taking the tiebreaker.



# **News Briefs:** Valley Center moves to Division III

It turns out that Valley Center's teams will race in CIF's Divison III after all.

There's been much speculation about the school's eventual placement, and the area's Division IV and Division III coaches have probably worn out numerous calculators trying to crunch the numbers

Jaguar coach Mike Cummings insisted early on that the school would probably grow in enrollment sufficiently to warrant the move upwards.

The CIF usually uses last year's enrollment figures to determine placement in divisions, which would have put Valley Center in Division IV, for schools with enrollments from 351 to 900 students for the top three grades.

The exception is when a school grows more than 15% in a year. Valley Center's enrollment was determined to be 1,002 for this fall, up from last year's 828.

Now in Division III are Valley Center, University City, La Jolla and the University of San Diego, all with strong overall programs, plus Hoover, Kearny, Southwest of El Centro, Central Union of El Centro, Brawley, Mission Bay, Madison, Our Lady of Peace, Crawford and San Dieguito Academy, many of which have



The large school girls race was very competitive, with a number of high-ranked teams running strongly.


Mt. Carmel's girls won the team title, with 53 points, just ahead of Rancho Bernardo (60) and University City (73).


