Athletes that are in the midst of comebacks from injuries and/or illness are hoping that they'll improve greatly by season's end.


Athletes that have been grinding through workouts since early summer are looking forward to the tapering process.

News Briefs: Coaches agree to Friday for CIF

The CIF's cross country coaches advisory panel agreed, without dissent, to hold this year's CIF Finals on Friday, November 16.

The switch was necessary because of a scheduling snafu with the San Diego City Parks Department.

The coaches agreed on a tentative schedule that would begin

with the first race at 10 a.m. The exact order of races will be the same as in the state meet, although the times of the races will be different.

The main difference, besides the late start, will be a compaction of the schedule, with races scheduled every 35 minutes.

T-Tags are IDs for runners on the go

It took a brush with tragedy for the T-Tag to become an idea.

T-Tags are small velcro strips that are designed to be attached to footwear, such as running shoes, but they could also be used by walkers, hikers, skaters or bikers. The strips have just enough room for basic ID: a name and a phone number, in case of emergency.

The idea came from Eric Mattson, a Fallbrook resident, after his daughter, a senior in college, was hit by a car.

His daughter, Tricia Mattson, was in her workout clothing, without ID, and on a road run when she was struck by a car in April. She suffered massive head injuries in the accident, and was taken to a nearby trauma center.

It was more than five hours before the Mattson family learned of the accident, and that was only because Tricia regained consciousness briefly and told an attendant her phone number.

Mattson came up with the idea of an easy-to-carry ID tag that runners (or others) could attach to their shoes. The T-Tags (the T is for Tricia) are available at the local Movin' Shoes stores, as well as Chick's Sporting Goods in Oceanside.

There is a happy ending. Tricia Mattson, a section 1600 champ while at Fallbrook High, has recovered from the accident.





Dual Meet Roundup:

Final meets important to many teams

Things are coming down to the wire in many leagues, as some key final showdowns will put some teams at an advantage in their league finals.

Dual meets help determine the league titlists in every league, and, in some, they are the only method of determining team champions.

The latest results, and their impact:

Palomar: Mt. Carmel, Vista unbeaten in boys; big girls showdown looms

BOYS: The Palomar is quiet in mid-season, with no meets scheduled this week or last week.

Mt. Carmel and Vista are both 2-0 in dual meets, and are currently ranked 1-2, respectively, in the section. That makes their upcoming dual meet (next week) particularly attractive. Also on tap next week: RB vs. RBV and Poway vs. Torrey Pines.

Torrey Pines edged Rancho Buena Vista, 26-29, on October 5. The Longhorns had sickness going through their roster at the time, and cancelled a planned appearance at San Luis Obispo to allow time for recuperation. In this league, there is no margin for error; any team is capable of beating any other team.

GIRLS: The final week of duals will be crucial. Rancho Bernardo, currently ranked second in the section, will host Torrey Pines and Mt. Carmel. These are arguably the strongest three girls programs of the last few years, and all have quality teams again.

The last duals were October 5, when Torrey Pines had perhaps their best team effort of the year, in a 20-38 win over a good RBV team. The win was all the more impressive since Torrey ace Dani Schuster took a wrong turn during the race and didn't finish.

That same week, Poway beat Mt. Carmel on a tie-breaker, and RB defeated Vista. In the RB/Vista dual, Allison Hall and Lindsay delaMontaigne aired it out on the Guajome Park course, running to impressive 14:33 and 14:35 clockings.

How tough is this league? Mt. Carmel and Vista are both winless to date.

Valley: Valley Center, San Pasqual are rolling

BOYS: When league meets started, Valley Center took their

running to a higher level. After soso efforts in some early invitationals, the Jaguars looked good in dual meets, with big wins over Escondido and Ramona.

San Pasqual is also 2-0, with wins over Ramona and Orange

GIRLS: San Pasqual is rolling. The section's top-ranked team is 2-0 and unchallenged in league meets, with big wins over Ramona and Orange Glen.

Valley Center is also 2-0, with wins over Escondido and Ramona, and they have the ability to challenge San Pasqual.

Avocado: Lots of good action still to come

BOYS: A lot of what-ifs? in this league. San Marcos is now 2-0, winning big over La Costa Canyon on October 5, after starting league action with a 26-29 win over Fallbrook. Fallbrook, meanwhile, had a close meet with El Camino, winning 26-29.

Carlsbad is 1-0, and had a bye on October 5. They still must face Fallbrook and San Marcos.

Like the other north county leagues, the Avo goes quiet for two weeks in mid-season, allowing teams to concentrate on the last big invitationals.

GIRLS: The showdown between Fallbrook and El Camino was big. Fallbrook, on their home course, won 23-37. Katie Matlack won, followed by the St. Laurent sisters, but the Warriors put together a good pack, and they finished 4-5-6-7-8 to close out a good El Camino team. The Fallbrook two though seven runners were 0:52 seconds apart.

A good La Costa Canyon team hasn't been in much league action yet, but is 1-0 after a big win over San Marcos. They still have meets with El Camino, Fallbrook and Carlsbad.

Carlsbad, meanwhile, is returning runners from the injured list, and getting better. They are 0-1, but that was a 29-27 loss to El Camino. They still must run La Costa Canyon and Fallbrook. **Grossmont South:** Granite, Valhalla boys showdown due; Helix girls are sailing

BOYS: Granite Hills is 3-0 and Valhalla is 2-0 in early league action. Both teams beat a good Helix squad in separate meets.

Granite used a good pack to beat the Highlanders 26-29, on October 5, at Harry Griffen Park. Granite then won big over Monte Vista, 18-43, on October 12 at Chollas Lake.

Valhalla beat Monte Vista, 20-41, on October 5, at Griffen, and had a bye last week.

GIRLS: Helix is 3-0, and rolling, with wins over Valhalla, Granite Hills and Mount Miguel. In the Mount Miguel dual, Stephanie Baird blistered the Lindo Lake 2.1-mile course in 11:58.

Valhalla (1-1) and Granite Hills (2-1) have yet to race, and that meet could determine the runnerup spot in the league.

Grossmont North: West Hills looks good; Braves could challenge in boys

BOYS: West Hills has had smooth sailing to date, at 2-0, but still must run against El Cajon Valley and El Capitan. The meet with El Cajon could be close.



GIRLS: West Hills hasn't been challenged yet, and is 2-0. The Wolfpack are solidly in the area's top ten teams.

Probably the best meet left is the El Capitan/Grossmont dual, which could help decide second place in this league.

Mesa: Chula vs. Bonita will be B-I-G

BOYS: Chula Vista and Bonita Vista are both unbeaten, and each team had close wins over a Sweetwater team that is finally getting healthy.

Bonita beat the Red Devils, 27-28, on October 5, at Rohr Park. Chula then edged Sweetwater, 27-29, on October 11, also at Rohr. The Chula/Bonita matchup should he a classic.

Sweetwater is finally back at near full strength after battling injuries most of the season, but they now have two losses by a total of three points.

GIRLS: Bonita Vista and Chula Vista are chewing up their opponents, and setting up a nice showdown. Bonita's point totals in their three wins to date have been 15, 15 and 16; nearly perfect. Chula has been almost as dominant as they await the return of their ace, Sophia Marquez, who was injured at the Dana Hills Invitational.

South Bay: MV in control in boys; CP, Eastlake have girls showdown on sked

BOYS: Mar Vista took over control of the boys race with a 25-30 win over Eastlake on the Mariners' beach course, on October 11. Mar Vista already has wins over Hilltop and Castle Park.

Eastern: Cavers, Henry look good; three girls teams are unbeaten

BOYS: San Diego made a statement with their 23-38 win over Point Loma last week. The Pointers' Eric Dunn won in 15:41, one of the faster runs on the Eastern Morley course this year.

The Cavers still have a big showdown left with Patrick Henry.

Scripps lead for now

BOYS: It's a deep league, and few meets are expected to be easy, but this is almost ridiculous.

Scripps Ranch is 2-0, after beating La Jolla, on October 4, and Hoover, on October 11. Both races were won on tie-breakers.

University City opened with a loss to Mission Bay, on October 4, when the Centurions were caught looking ahead to a weekend invitational. The Bucs' Marco Venancio won the race in 16:37 and



had good support from his teammates in pulling the upset.

GIRLS: UC's team is in good shape after early meets, but their stiffest challenge could come from Scripps Ranch. Scripps beat La Jolla, 25-30, on October 4. Their lineup has been upgraded by the improvement of their young runners. La Jolla and University of San Diego are still in contention, but both have one loss already. Harbor: 'Nado on top

BOYS: Coronado seems in control after dual wins over Clairemont and Crawford, who were expected to be their toughest rivals. Fastest times on the Harbor layout of the Morley course have been 17:27s by Clairemont's Thomas Ferguson and Coronado frosh Jake Ruzevick in separate races.

The Harbor is one league that uses dual meets exclusively to determine league titles.

GIRLS: Coronado is dominating this group. They have yet to race Madison, which is the only opponent left that can give them a challenge.

Southern: Hawks, Eagles trade wins in girls

GIRLS: This league also uses dual meets to determine the league titles exlusively, but with a twist; each team meets twice.

Mountain Empire edged Julian, 26-29, at Lake Morena, October 12, to put the standings into a tie. Julian had beaten the Red Hawks earlier in the year, in a meet that went to a tie-breaker. This time, Mountain Empire left no doubt, with Ali Baker leading her teammates to a 1-2-4 finish. When the back of the pack did the job, they had the win.

SouthernCal Lindsay rips a 14:20 to lead RB

At this year's Southern California Invitational, they saved the best for last. Or, nearly last.

Rancho Bernardo freshman Lindsay delaMontaigne, in the final girls varsity race of the day, ran a notable 14:20 for the 2.45-mile

Her time is the fastest ever recorded by a Rancho Bernardo athlete on this historically muchused course

That's significant because the Broncos have had some quick girls run there in recent years, including Julie Manson, Sarah Wilkins, Kaleena Yee, Allison Hall, and now, delaMontaigne.

Hall, a senior, missed the meet to take an SAT test.

The SoCal meet has a unique format, which is to run each team's number one runner against every other team's number one runner, and so on through the roster.

The team winners are determined by the combined time of their entrants in the seven varsity

It makes for a lot of racing, with 14 separate varsity races (seven girls finals, seven boys finals) before the meet even gets around to staging JV and frosh/soph competitions.

RB's team was the fastest girls squad in attendance, no matter how

you sliced it. They were first in the large schools division, with faster times than highly regarded University City. UC was in the small schools division, although the athletes actually all competed in the same races.

RB's effort came without any contribution from team ace Hall, who is having a great year.

In fact, Hall and delaMontaigne had put up some quick times on the same course in a dual meet just a week before. In a dual with Vista, Hall had run 14:33, with delaMontaigne at 14:35.

At these races, the Broncos got solid efforts from their entire lineup. Belinda Oberem ran 15:23 for the next fastest time on the team.

The boys competition was dominated by a Barstow team that is highly rated at the state level. Their runners were first in five of the seven varsity races.

The boys number one race was won impressively by Sultana of Hesperia's Danny Lyon, who was timed in 16:03 on the 3.22-mile

Many top athletes missed the meet because of SAT testing conflicts. Among the missing were RB's Hall and Valley Center's Cooper Bachman. Some teams were missing several key

The weather, which warmed up significantly as the day wore on, was a factor. Some of the athletes in the early races made big breakthroughs. Some of the athletes running much later got cooked.





St. Augustine Jenna's 15:28 is a course best

Jenna Timinsky has run some sizzling solo races at Morley Field this year.

The San Dieguito Academy senior kicked off the year with the second-fastest time ever in the Mt. Carmel Invitational in September, running 14:58 for 2.6 miles. The meet record is 14:55.

She looked even better at the St. Augustine Invitational, on October 5. She ran the CIF girls course, which is 2.75 miles, in 15:28.

By a good margin, that is the fastest time recorded on that layout since that course was established in 1998. No runner in any of the CIF finals since then has run under 16 minutes (see box).

Timinsky's margin of victory at St. Augustine was 1:44, so she was alone after the first step. It was similar to her Mt. Carmel race, when she won by 1:38.

By contrast, the boys race went down to the wire, with La Jolla Country Day soph Tyler Middleton edging St. Augustine senior Nathan Stender, 16:38 to 16:39.

The running conditions were nearly ideal, with cool temperatures aiding the athletes.

The Saints Invite is an annual showcase for the area's smaller schools, which seem to produce more than their share of this area's fastest runners (Mark Hauser, Josh Cox, Marissa Hurwitz, Angela Petersen, Julie Ott, and Will Kraemer, to name a few).

Boys team champions included University of San Diego (D-III), Coronado (D-IV), and Rehoboth Christian, from New Mexico (D-V). Calvin Christian was second in D-V to lead the local teams.

Girls titles went to USD (D-III), La Jolla Country Day (D-IV) and Rehoboth (D-V). Julian, by a wide margin, was the best local D-V girls team.

In Divisions IV and V, almost every significant local team was entered, so those results could be used as a scouting report for the upcoming CIF championships (see accompanying story).

The results:

At Morley Field, Friday, October 5.
The meet used the CIF course for both boys and girls. One exception was the second loop of the picnic/Upas St. hill section. This meet ran the same direction both times through, while the CIF meet reverses the direction the second time around. Weather: ideal conditions; cool and overcast.
