Final meets to be raced on 'new' Morley

magine the following scene at the start of the CIF Championships:
The crowd is hushed, expectant.
The huge field of runners is poised, ready to race. The starter is giving his last-minute instructions.

"All right, gentlemen...Take one step back off the line...Now, get out your maps..."

What is this, orienteering?
That's a bit of an exaggeration, but it highlights some of the confusion in the last two weeks about the exact nature of the championship course.


When the city's Parks and Rec department decided to seed a key portion of the CIF course, local cross country coaches quickly found out that they had limited options.

Coaches that were hosting championship meets were told that the seeded portion of the course was not to be used until at least early December.

That puts Morley on schedule to host the Footlocker National Championship meet as scheduled, but rules out the normal course for league and CIF competitions.

"We can't have the old course," Mike Cummings, this year's CIF Meet director, said. The North County Conference is this year's section meet host, and Cummings, Torrey Pines coach Brent Thorne and Rancho Buena Vista coach Tom Lux toured the facility early this week.

Their conclusions were that the course would have to be

redesigned or, "there would have to be a change of venue," according to Cummings. The change of site, especially with short notice, was the least appealing alternative, according to Cummings.

The starting line area remains the same, but the runners will have to make a turn less than 200 yards into the race. Before, they had almost a quarter-mile straight to sort themselves out.

It places more of a premium on getting a good start, especially in the races with large fields. "That's just part of the course," Cummings said. "If you've gotta get out (fast), you've gotta get out."

"It'll be wide enough,"
Cummings said. "We think it's
manageable. It's not the perfect
solution, but it's probably the
best alternative."

The hill section of the course will remain the same.

"The mile mark is almost the exact same spot," Cummings said.

Morley Field is also the site of four league championships to be held next week; the Eastern, Western, Harbor and Coastal Leagues all will contest finals there.

Some of the leagues expect to race on a variation of their dual meet course, while others want to race the "new" CIF setup.

League, CIF Finals loom for runners

ow, it's time for the good stuff. The cross country season is fast approaching the climax: a series of championship meets, each increasing in importance. The season culminates with the national championships, held right here in San Diego's own Morley Field.

But, for most rank and file team members, the ultimate meets are much sooner.

Next week is league championship week, with finals scheduled Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

The schedule:

Tuesday: Eastern League Champs, at Morley Field.

Wednesday: Western League Champs, at Morley Field.

Thursday: Harbor League Champs, at Morley Field.

Friday: Avocado and Palomar League Champs, at Kit Carson Park.

Metro League Champs, at Southwestern College.

Coastal League Champs, at Morley Field.

Saturday: Grossmont 2A and 3A Champs, at Harry Griffen Park, in La Mesa.

The last two weeks have seen some interesting developments as teams are positioning themselves for the all-important stretch run.

The last series of league dual meets were scheduled this week, with a championship or two still up for grabs, but the emphasis for most was being ready for the finals.

Among the hottest runners are Mira Mesa's Larry Henderson, Hoover's Ayub Abdusalam, Santana's Jaymie Harper, USD's Vanessa Hanley, and Torrey Pines' Devon Straitiff.

Vista's boys and girls have continued their strong recent

The how and why of what we do...

uestions that I might ask of Track
Magazine if I were you:
What's with the delivery system?
Sometimes we get it in the mail, sometimes it
appears at our school. What happened to
those addresses we sent you?

Our delivery system is very much ad lib right now. We need to find a reliable, speedy system. Mailing to each athlete has proved to be unworkable, as well as expensive.

Until we get a system worked out, it's a combination of methods. For instance, if there's a meet on Saturday, right after publication, I use that meet for distribution.

I also make personal deliveries to many schools, driving from Fallbrook to Southwest to Valhalla. Other schools will always receive their copies in the mail.

Who gets what and when will vary with a number of factors. *TM* is printed in San Marcos, so the first deliveries will extend outward from that area. I'll skip schools that I know I'll see the next day.

If you sent an address list, you haven't wasted your time. Those rosters are extremely useful in checking names and spelling.

I don't see our school's races in your paper. Why not?

Ask your coach. We put in just about everything that is sent to us, by mail, phone or fax. We attend many meets, and make many calls in search of info, but can't reach everybody (some coaches are notoriously hard to call). We welcome all results.

A tip for the coaches: make sure your information is relatively complete. In several instances, we have received race results with only first names listed. A few other coaches sent well-prepared summaries that included only their own team's names and times. Best to send the actual results sheet, if legible.

We see our team's results sometimes but no photos. Why not?

Our photo coverage will eventually touch upon almost every team in the San Diego Section, which includes 68 schools that have cross country programs.

To date, our photo selection has been systematically random, and we factor in the quality of the photo, and the importance of the race or athlete. We are acutely aware of which teams get exposure and which don't. There are three more issues (after this one) that will cover the cross country season, so be patient.

What are you going to write about in January and February?

Not much, as it turns out.

Our publication schedule looks like this: Next issue will publish on Nov. 18. It will cover the last week of duals and all the league championships, and will be distributed

We then publish on Dec. 2, with coverage of the CIF and State championship meets.

ither we're getting better, or our readers are letting more mistakes slip by unnoticed. The bottom line is there are fewer mistakes to report this time.

There was one case of slightly mistaken identification. Melissa Carter is the correct name for the San Marcos girl pictured in the last issue, not Melissa Cortez. I got the name from one of the finish boards at the Southern Cal Invitational, right off the handwritten tag.

I'm the last person to complain about handwriting. My own is eccentric, to say the least.

Once a prospective employer asked for a handwriting sample for analysis. My hand was a bit rusty, since I usually type everything. I didn't get the job.

There was also a serious oversight in the last issue. In writing about the Hoover cross country program, I left out an important individual.

When researching this story, Mitrovich was the first person I talked to. His enthusiasm for cross country was contagious, and he spoke highly of Telford, his coaching and the school's cultural melting pot.

"Cross country runners are my favorite athletes," he said then. "They are self-starting, they're strong-minded and they aren't egocentric."

Hal Mitrovich is a first-class gentleman, and his omission from that story is the type of mistake that bothers me more than most.



A few key dual meets have shed some light on league or CIF championships. Some teams are still struggling with health or injury problems.


A recap of the significant developments of the last two weeks.

DUAL MEETS:


Scripps Ranch boys team is back on top of their game, after a mid-season slump. The Falcons had a showdown dual with Hoover, on Oct. 26 at Morley, that both teams wanted badly.

Hoover's Abdusalam moved away from Scripps' Kevin Bowes at the two mile mark to win the individual race, but the key to the dual was back in the pack.

Scripps' David Romero moved up steadily throughout the race, and finished third, while teammates Chad Livesay and Afran Abutin were fourth and fifth to seal the win. The first five Scripps runners bunched up

USD's Hanley ran away with the race, one in a series of recent impressive outings, and led her team to a one-point win over La Jolla. The Dons had key support from Erin Shea, Kristin Epperson and Amy Morrison.

The teams will dice it up again at the league's championship, with Our Lady of Peace also figuring in as a threat. Whichever team emerges as the league's best will play a key role in the CIF Division III race.

A late development saw OLP's girls upset USD in the last dual of the season. Key Don runner Erin Shea is nursing a stress fracture and sitting out selected meets. It's an open question if she'll be available for championship action

No team is running stronger, counting both boys and girls teams, than Vista. They laid low

on the last invitational weekend and then put the hammer down against Mt. Carmel and Orange Glen in a double dual, on Oct. 28.

The Vista boys team swept the first five places against a quality Mt. Carmel team, and the Panther girls also won big, 19-39.

For the Vista girls, it was the first win over Mt. Carmel since 1986.

"They not only beat us every year but their worst score was something like 20 points," Vista girls coach Paul Kinder said, recalling the long, dry spell. "The road to the Palomar League championship always goes through Mt. Carmel."

"I know that Mt. Carmel's boys didn't run very well," Vista boys coach Craig Balsley said. "They've got a better team than that."

The Sundevils have gone through a stretch of illness that dates back at least to the Poway dual. Ace Greg Nett was among the latest to be afflicted.

Vista's teams, meanwhile, keep getting stronger. The boys team recently added transfer Joe Briceno to their top five, while the girls team got quality runner Ivette Solano off the ineligibilty list.

A sidebar to the Vista/Mt. Carmel race was the further emergence of the fast-improving Orange Glen girls. They beat Mt. Carmel in that meet, by 27-28, and are now a ranked team. The Patriots used strong races by their 3-4-5 runners to win the meet.

Chula Vista's boys continue to run well. They dominated decent Bonita Vista and Castle Park teams in a double dual, packing in five of the first eight runners against the two schools.

Also in the Metro, Bonita
Vista's girls continue to hold the
fort until Claire Becker returns,
while Montgomery's boys have
kept some championship hopes
alive with recent strong
performances.

Valhalla's and Granite Hills' girls teams are both unbeaten in the Grossmont 3A League, heading for a showdown on the final day of the season.

Valhalla's Stephanie Nelle is primed for the finals, while Granite Hills has been strengthened by the recent addition of Stacey Murphy, last year's frosh flash.

The Helix boys are on cruise mode in the Grossmont 3A, and West Hills' boys continue to pace the Grossmont 2A.

The league's 2A girls meet could be a wide-open affair. West Hills' girls will probably go into the the league finals unbeaten but Santana's girls, with Jaymie Harper laying waste to course records, are pulling on the leaders. When the two teams met on Oct. 28, West Hills came away with a 27-29 win.

El Capitan will also be a factor, as team leaders Larissa Gregerson and Jenny Card are running well, and the pack is starting to coalesce behind them. The team went 1 through 9 against El Cajon in a recent dual.


Crawford's girls team beat
Coronado handily in a Harbor
League dual, 20-37. The Colts
put five girls across in a span of
1:08 to finish 2-3-4-5-6 behind
Coronado's Jessica Lunt. They
thus claimed at least a share of
the league crown.

Also in the Harbor League, Clairemont beat Lincoln in a dual that has implications for later competition in the CIF Division IV meet. One of those teams will likely qualify for Fresno, after Coronado. Lincoln was missing ace Ismail Mohamed in the loss to the Chiefs, which means the rematch is up for grabs.

Point Loma's boys team is beating all comers in the Eastern League. They recently bested Patrick Henry on Oct. 25, although neither team was at its best. Henry was missing top gun

Alex Gonzales, while the Pointers prevailed despite a sub-par race from their number one, Chris Werdenberg. The Pointers officially wrapped up the dual meet title with a win against Kearny.

Mira Mesa's Larry Henderson has been impressive, and might rank with Hoover's Abdusalam as the best section boy runner.

The pair have not met in direct competition this season, although the Hoover ace has bested Henderson's times in separate races at the Bronco and

Mt. Carmel Invites.

Henderson is hot, running a course record at Kit Carson and getting amped up in duals. On Nov. 1, he clocked 15:00 on the "new" Morley dual layout.

North County teams making moves includes San Dieguito's boys and both San Pasqual teams.

San Dieguito opened a few eyes with a 16-39 thumping of a good Fallbrook team, with Noah Randles and Chris Gabriel leading the way. Fallbrook's boys were just coming off a strong Mt. SAC effort.

San Pasqual's boys are gathering strength, evidenced by a 24-31 win over Ramona. Although the Pasqual girls were beaten by Ramona, 25-30, they showed enough to be considered a factor in CIF Division II.

Poway's boys team beat
Rancho Bernardo in a meet that
was punctuated by a freak
injury. RB's number two, Ryan
Sanders, was nearing the finish
and holding third place when he
tripped, fell and shattered his
elbow.

He was assisted to his feet by teammates and finished seventh, but the setback was enough to turn the meet around. Sanders now wears a cast from shoulder to wrist and his availability for the remainder of the season is questionable, to say the least.

"We just have to go on," a clearly frustrated RB coach Don Jones said. The Broncos have battled injuries all season and seemed to be getting healthy at last, before this latest setback.

Poway's girls have had some recent bouts with illness, although the worst seems to be over. Jessica Pound sat out Mt. SAC, but ran against RB. Lisa Callan was lost to the team in mid-season with mononucleosis.

The Coastal League is no closer to determining a clear-cut boys team leader.

Calvin Christian and Bishop's both recently beat Francis Parker in duals and will clash in the final week, but no team has really stood out.

Individually, Tri-City's
Ryan Swanson bested Julian's
Todd Lewis in a dual, and thus
became the favorite to win the
league race.

Bishop's girls have no real challenger and have added depth with Marissa Hurwitz' return to competition. Nichola Lowry is injured, and possibly gone for the year.

MT. SAC:

Chula Vista's boys team
faced the toughest competition,
in the Division I Sweepstakes
team race. That field included
fourteen state-ranked teams, including powerhouse Thousand
Oaks.

Chula Vista was seventh in the race, using a tight pack, with a spread of 45 seconds from one through five. In team times, the Spartans were 50 seconds behind the second place team, Jesuit of Carmichael.

Race winner Thousand Oaks was on another level entirely. They packed in five runners in 42 seconds, taking spots 3-8-9-13-16 in a loaded field.

ners at Mt. SAC were El Camino's Tom Kloos, who ran 15:37 on the demanding 3.0-mile course, and Ramona's Veronica Clark, who was timed in 18:38.

Fallbrook's Sharon Rohde also had a notable effort. She ran 19:24, and became the second fastest Fallbrook girl to run at Mt. SAC. The school's best, of course, was Milena Glusac, who clocked 17:15 in 1992.


Glusac's time was also a course record for all schools until this year's meet, when Santa Rosa sophomore Julia Stamps ran an amazing 16:58. Stamps ran her last half mile in 2:26 to slice a big chunk off Glusac's mark, and establish herself as an early favorite for the Footlocker Nationals next month.

Coronado's boys team made a name for themselves at SAC, when they won the Division IV Sweepstakes race. The Islanders won a close race against Maranatha and Salesian. The scoring was so close (Coronado 80, both Maranatha and Salesian 83), that Coronado coach Mel Bechtel and his team didn't even know they won the race until the next day.


Junior Trevor Clarke and senior Mike Aguilar led the effort, placing fourth and seventh.

The Islanders are now ranked fifth in the state in Division IV, and are heavy favorites in the CIF Division IV race.

"That's one of the reasons we wanted to go up there (to Mt. SAC)," Bechtel said. "We wanted that good competition."





Other section teams that won races included La Jolla (girls varsity Div. III); Mission Bay (boys varsity Div. III); West Hills (boys frosh Div. III); and Poway (boys frosh Div. I).

West Hills' girls, led by
Alexis Rendina, went 1-2-6 in a
Div. III frosh race, but didn't
field a full team.

Bonita Vista's girls, still
without a rehabbing Claire
Becker, continue to impress.
They were fourth in the Division
II team sweepstakes race.

KIT CARSON:

The Kit Carson Invitational, now in its second year, continues to grow as an alternative to Mt. SAC.

Mira Mesa's Henderson creamed the old meet record for boys, running 15:38 for 3.1 miles. He chopped 18 seconds off the old mark, held by San Pasqual's Manuel Romero.

Grossmont's David McQuitty was also under the old record, at 15:47.

The girls meet record was under similar attack. Mira Mesa's Mariel Gray ran 15:47 to establish the mark last year.

the Division II race with 15:44, and Torrey's Straitiff topped that in the Division I race (15:31).

Valhalla's Stephanie Nelle (15:41) and Vista's Sonia Rodriguez (15:45) also dipped under the old mark.
