# There's still time for quality workouts

The name of the game now is running well at the right time.

Or, simply, peaking.

Coaches all over the section are dusting off their favorite end-of-the-season workouts.

It's not an exact science, however, as even the coaches most noted for having their teams"ready to race" know that there are factors not entirely under their control.

It's an art, combining coaching and training knowledge, forming a season-long structure of training, and fine-tuning it with an eye to weather, personalities, individual ability, quality of the competition, course difficulty, health, and realistic goals.

The team's ability comes into play, too. Do you aim your peak for the league finals? Or, for CIF? Or, if you are likely to be there, for the state meet?

There was one coach in recent years who was so convinced of his team's ability that he was considering peaking his athletes for the Footlocker regionals, but that's another story.

Actually, a large number of athletes have already finished their season (by the time you are likely reading this).

The north county leagues, which usually, as a group, have the largest teams, do not offer junior varsity competition at their league finals. That means a sizable number of pretty good runners end their seasons this week, in the final dual meets.

After next week's league finals, all of the teams will be slimmed down to seven athletes apiece, at the most.

Things are getting interesting.
Next week, league championships will be held, and there will be
team and/or individual champions

Competition starts Tuesday, at Morley Field, where the Harbor League has a final meet that

determines all-league teams. The team champs in that league were decided by dual meets.

On Wednesday, the action shifts to El Centro, where the Imperial Valley League meets.

On Thursday, the spotlight goes back to Morley, where the Western League final will finally determine the team champions.

On Friday, you can take your pick among three meets.

At Rohr Park, in Bonita, the Mesa and South Bay leagues hold combined races to determine separate championships.

At Morley Field, the Eastern League final is scheduled, with everything at stake, especially in the girls team competition.

At Kit Carson Park, in Escondido, the Coastal and Southern Leagues hold combined races, with the results separated later.

On the girls team, Nastassja Hall has returned to action. Hall was sidelined with Achilles problems for a few weeks, but made a quicker than expected recovery.


### Scripps Ranch girls

# Some races still undecided

The last-minute action in selected leagues around the section. The leagues are presented alphabetically:

### Avocado:

In a league where there are only five teams, and where the final week includes a three-way meet, there is not a lot of regular season action.

Fallbrook, Carlsbad and La Costa Canyon have all had just two dual meets to date, and those three teams will meet Friday, November 2.

BOYS: San Marcos is 3-0, and has a meet left with El Camino (1-2, but dangerous). Fallbrook (1-1) and Carlsbad (1-1) will narrow it down as to which team will be in position to challenge San Marcos in the league meet, which counts for half of the league title.

GIRLS: Fallbrook (2-0), La Costa Canyon (2-0) and a dangerous Carlsbad (1-1) team will face off in the last meet to determine the dual meet portion of the league title. This is a tough league; a quality El Camino outfit has just one win. Whichever team comes out of this league with the title will be one of the favorites in the Division I CIF race.

### Coastal:

BOYS: La Jolla Country Day is cruising at 6-0, with recent wins over Bishop's, 26-29, on October 16, and over Calvin Christian, 24-32, on October 25. Fighting it out for the next spot are Calvin Christian, Bishop's and Tri City Christian.

GIRLS: La Jolla Country Day and San Dieguito Academy were both unbeaten going into the season's final week.


### Eastern:

GIRLS: The West Hills girls were at an unchallenged 3-0 going into a final meet with a Grossmont team that Wolfpack coach Bill Cleves was determined not to overlook.

### **Grossmont South:**

BOYS: Granite Hills closed out their dual season at 4-0, beating Valhalla, 23-35, at West Hills on October 26. It was a battle of unbeaten teams, with both squads having a dual meet win over a Helix squad that is ranked in the state's top ten in Division II.

GIRLS: Helix was in cruise mode here, with a 3-0 record and a meet left with Monte Vista (1-2). Valhalla took over second place with a 24-34 win over Granite Hills. The Norse were led by a 1-2 finish from sisters Kristina and Alicia Nugent.

### Harbor:

BOYS: Coronado finished off a 6-0 dual season after they defeated Madison on October 30. The Islanders were not pressed in any of their duals. In the Harbor, duals decide everything, so Coronado is the champ.

GIRLS: The Islanders were 6-0 in girls racing, too, wrapping up the Harbor title with a 25-30 win over Madison on October 30.

### Mesa:

BOYS: A series of razor-close meets left Bonita Vista at 4-0. They beat Chula Vista on October 25, by 27-28.

The Barons made a big move as a team in the last three-fourths of a mile to just nip the Spartans.

Ryan Becijos moved up to second place and Sven Meza and Nick Amalfitano finished up at fourth and fifth to offset a 1-3 by Chula's Andres Padilla and Ysmael Miranda.

Bonita had also beaten Sweetwater, 27-28, in an earlier meet. The Devils had lost to Chula Vista, 27-29, putting them into third place by a total of three points.

GIRLS: Bonita wrapped things up at 4-0, ending with a big win (19-38) over a good Chula Vista team. Chula had just returned Sophia Marquez from the injured list, but it wasn't enough to keep Bonita's top-end from going 1-2-3-5 on the Spartans.

### Palomar:

BOYS: It's never over in this tough league.

Mt. Carmel's team has yet to make a misstep against local opposition this season, and they seem to be improving. They faced perhaps their toughest meet to date when they beat Vista, on October

25. Still left on the Sundevils' schedule was a double dual with Torrey Pines and Rancho Bernardo. Torrey is coming off a 21-37 win over Poway.

Vista, Poway and Rancho Buena Vista will duke it out on the tough Lake Poway course. In no other league in the county would quality squads such as Poway and RBV both be at 1-2.

GIRLS: It goes down to the final meet, with Rancho Bernardo (3-0) hosting Torrey Pines (3-0) and Mt. Carmel (0-3) at Rancho Bernardo Community Park.

At Lake Poway, RBV, Poway and Vista all bring 1-2 records to the meet. All are quality teams, needless to say.

### South Bay:

BOYS: Mar Vista was at 3-0 with wins over all of their significant opposition. Eastlake (2-1) and Hilltop (2-1) still had to settle second place in the dual standings.

GIRLS: Eastlake may have taken control of the race after beating Castle Park, 27-31, at Discovery Park, on October 25. The Trojans went 1-2, with Mandy Johnson and Ana Melvin, but the Titans had six of the next seven runners, led by Mercedes Razo, Silvia Romero and Pati Romero in third, fourth and fifth.

Eastlake still has to finish up with a good Hilltop (2-1) team. Southern:

BOYS: It's hard to stay unbeaten in a league where each team has ten dual meets. At press time, Mountain Empire and Lutheran each had one loss apiece.

GIRLS: Mountain Empire and Julian both had one loss apiece going into the final week, and seemed destined to finish in a tie for first in a league where dual meets decide the championship.

This league had quality everywhere, with decent teams like USD and the Saints each having just one win apiece. UC, a solid



# Mt. SAC:

# Course gives up fast times

When did Mt. SAC turn into Dana Hills?

The venerated course yielded a number of very fast times last month during the annual two-day cross country meet.

None of the times was as scorching as Ukiah's Amber Trotter's meet record of 16:16 in the girls individual sweeps race on Saturday, October 20. Trotter swept away the old course record of 16:38 in a sensational effort.

One day earlier, San Dieguito Academy's Jenna Timinsky made a breakthrough when she beat Corona del Mar's Julie Allen and Sacred Heart's Shannon Rowbury in winning the girls sweeps race in 17:16. It was an outstanding effort that was, at the time, the tenth fastest ever recorded in the meet.

Why all the speed?

Bonita Vista coach Ian Cumming observed that this year's weather was cooler than in most years.

West Hills girls coach Bill Cleves figures that the course is just plain running faster now, as the historic layout has been finetuned in recent years.

At last report, the course now tapes out to 2.91 miles, which helps make up for some of the fabled course difficulty.

Other local highlights included: Fallbrook's Katie Matlack ran 18:03 to take second in the same sweeps race where Trotter ran 16:16.

Good efforts by the Helix top two of Babey Wagnew (15:16) and Taylor Williams (15:31), which

were the best times by locals.

A good team race by the Mt. Carmel boys, who were the second team in the large school individual sweeps race. Abadir Barre was just a bit off, at 15:42, but the other team members included Alan Aradanas (15:38), Adam Goldberg (16:04), Mike Rentz (16:40) and Elliott Davey (16:41).

Store this away for future reference: Rancho Buena Vista, a pack team, had four runners in front of Mt. Carmel's number four runner, although not in head-tohead racing.

Another team to watch is the the Bonita Vista girls. They had four runners (on time) ahead of Helix's number two, or RBV's number two, or Poway's number one. Their first three were ahead of West Hills' number one.


